TITLE: Establishment of ASTEC Peripheral Campus Fee

- 1. WHEREAS, it is the purpose of the Associated Students of the University of Wyoming
- 2. (ASUW) Student Government to support and promote its Programs and Services; and,
- 3. WHEREAS, ASUW Senate Bill #2464 establishes a core and peripheral campus; and,
- 4. WHEREAS, the Associated Students Technical Services (ASTEC) defines peripheral
- 5. campus, as shown in the map in Addendum A, as any location for which they require
- 6. transporting equipment with the assistance of their freight vehicle; and,
- 7. WHEREAS, conducting services within the peripheral campus adds additional cost and labor
- 8. to employees of ASTEC and the addition of a fee may encourage students to be proactive
- 9. using core campus venues.
- 10. THEREFORE, be it enacted by the Associated Students of the University of Wyoming
- 11. (ASUW) Student Government that a \$50 fee be added when services are requested within the
- 12. peripheral area of campus and require transporting equipment with assistance of their freight
- 13. vehicle; and,
- 14. THEREFORE, be it further enacted that the fee be evaluated and adjusted as needed by
- 15. Associated Students Technical Services (ASTEC) and ASUW prior to applying for any fee
- 16. book change in accordance with the normal fee book application process; and,
- 17. THEREFORE, be it further enacted that this fee can be appealed through correspondence
- 18. through ASTEC and the ASUW Budget and Planning Committee; and,
- 19. THEREFORE, be it further enacted that Senate Bill #2501 take effect at the start of the
