

Whereas, course fees are extremely important for the University to maintain and supply laboratories with proper and updated equipment; and

Whereas, each college has the knowledge and ability to properly disseminate collected fees between the different academic departments; and

Whereas, the current computer system is at maximum capacity in carrying individual course fees and any increase in the number of these fees will result in financial hardship for the University and thus, the students; and

Whereas, the current course fee structure is detrimental to the students of some colleges; and

Whereas, students and staff would benefit from the expedient distribution of financial aid with streamlining of course fees; and

Whereas, a change in the fee structure will make it possible for students at the University to accurately budget their college expenditures;

THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Student Senate of the Associated Students of the University of Wyoming, that we recommend the institution of a single lab fee for each college, based on the approximate average for each college in the 1991-92 academic school year, as designated below:
