Title: **Limitation of Areas of Law Practiced by the Students' Attorney**

1. WHEREAS, the Students' Attorney at the University of Wyoming currently
2. advises students in many different areas of law; and
3. WHEREAS, the position of the Students' Attorney is currently being reviewed
4. by the Students' Attorney Advisory Board; and
5. WHEREAS, the revised job description of the Students' Attorney states that the
6. Students' Attorney should be limited in the areas of law in which he/she may
7. practice; and
8. WHEREAS, the Students' Attorney is an employee of the Associated Students of
9. the University of Wyoming.
10. THEREFORE, be it enacted that the Student Senate of the Associated Students of
11. the University of Wyoming limits the areas of law which the Students' Attorney
12. can practice (see Attachment A) subject to the approval of the University of
13. Wyoming Board of Trustees.



Attachment A

Based on a student survey conducted by the Research and Information Committee of the Senate of the Associated Students of the University of Wyoming, the Students' Attorney Advisory Board recommends the Students' Attorney practice the following areas of law:

<u>Area of Law</u>	<u>Percent of Student Support*</u>
Housing Law	61%
Traffic Law	51%
Criminal Law	51%
Consumer Law**and Small Claims Court	37%

*Percentage of results are based on a survey conducted by the Research and Information Committee in February, 2000.

**Consumer Law practice will not be eligible for litigation and will not include Bankruptcy or Tax Law.
