Written Opinion on Legislative Intent Concerning Senate Bill #2255 Filed by Senator Fuentes and SAL Weaver
Regarding the ASUW By-Laws and Constitution

Hereby let it be known the official "Legislative Intent Concerning Senate Bill #2255 Filed by Senator Fuentes and SAL Weaver Regarding the ASUW By-Laws and Constitution" has been issued within the allotted ten days allowed by the ASUW By-laws; Article III, Section 3, Subsection D from the time of decision made. The Associated Students of the University of Wyoming Judicial Council deems there is no need to hear this complaint.

The Associated Students of the University of Wyoming (hereinafter ASUW) Judicial Council (hereinafter ASUWJC) has been called upon to assess the request for review regarding Senate Bill #2255 and Article IV §13 of the ASUW By-Laws. The ASUWJC finds that there are no procedural defects and no conflict with the constitution. The ASUWJC finds that the correct measures were taken to amend the ASUW By-Laws, and that this amendment was correctly approved by the required two-thirds of the Senate. Thus, the ASUWJC does not find it necessary to declare lines 19 and 20 and Addendum F of Senate Bill #2255 null and void.
