**TITLE:** Finance Policy Edits – Article 4

**SPONSORS:** Student Organization Funding Board

- 1. WHEREAS, the purpose of the Associated Students of the University of Wyoming (ASUW)
- 2. Student Government is to serve our fellow students in the best manner possible; and,
- 3. WHEREAS, the Finance Policy of the ASUW can be convoluted and confusing to students
- 4. both outside and within the ASUW; and,
- 5. WHEREAS, in an effort to promote transparency and accessibility for the ASUW, the
- 6. Student Organization Funding Board is working as a committee to balance marketing its
- 7. services to student organizations (SOs) to be able to expend the funds allocated to them,
- 8. assist SOs and their leaders with holding events, and updating its internal documents to be
- 9. more understandable for SOs and their leaders; and,
- 10. WHEREAS, minor grammatical edits are necessary to make the working documents of the
- 11. ASUW professional and comprehensible; and,
- 12. WHEREAS, the SOFB strives to be advocates for the students and leaders of SOs; and,
- 13. WHEREAS, the SOFB allocates funds budgeted to it and received from student fees back to
- 14. students; and,
- 15. WHEREAS, the SOFB strives to be good fiduciaries of this precious money; and,
- 16. WHEREAS, updates to policies are needed every so often to reflect the changing times; and,
- 17. WHEREAS, the changes shown in Addendum A fulfill the missions stated above.
- 18. THEREFORE, be it enacted by the Associated Students of the University of Wyoming
- 19. (ASUW) Student Government that the Finance Policy be amended to reflect the changes

#### Addendum A

# Article 4. Sanction for Failure to Comply with ASUW Finance Policy

## Section 4.01 General Violations of ASUW Finance Policy

- 1. RSOs receiving allocations of ASUW funds shall use them in accordance with their itemized requests and any additional stipulations placed on the allocations by the RSO Funding Board and/or the ASUW Senate.\_—Any changes made to an approved request must be reconsidered and approved by the RSO Funding Board prior to their use of the allocated funds.
- 2. Failure to comply with any provisions of this Article may result in the loss of funding for events that have not already taken place.
- 3. If an RSO uses ASUW <u>fundsmoney</u> for items explicitly disallowed by the ASUW Finance Policy, that RSO must repay those funds to the ASUW Student Government.
- 4. If an RSO violates any portion of the ASUW Finance Policy or any additional stipulations placed on the allocations by the RSO Funding Board and/or the ASUW Senate, it may be placed on probation an advisory term or suspended from applying for funding in the future.
- 5. All infractions of the ASUW Finance Policy or additional stipulations placed on an RSO by the RSO Funding Board or ASUW Senate stay on the RSO's record for one calendara year from the most recent infraction.
- 6. Infractions will be categorized into major and minor infractions as defined by the following table:

#### A. Minor Infractions

- 1. Failed to spend in accordance with itemized request submitted to the SO Funding Board;
- 2. Failed to use approved ticketing venue;
- 3. Failed to advertise ticketing locations in accordance with the ASUW Finance Policy;
- 4. SO bought things disallowed by the ASUW Finance Policy;
- 5. Post-event SO self-evaluation was not completed within thirty (30) days;
- 6. Videos purchased by ASUW were not returned to ASUW;
- 7. SO failed to put ASUW Logo on all promotional materials, including but not limited to: all social media outlets, posters, flyers, and handouts.

#### B. Major Infractions

- 1. Charged admission for or collected registration fees from UW students;
- 2. Failed to advertise ticketing locations in accordance with ASUW Finance Policy;
- 3. Failed to advertise off-campus events on campus;

- 4. Violated any laws, including but not limited to: presence of illegal substances, paraphernalia, underage drinking at an event;
- 5. SO violated any ASUW Finance Policies while being on an advisory term;
- 6. Disregard of prior notice of infraction provided by an ASUW executive;
- 1.7. For any single SO event funded that violates three (3) or more minor infractions those cumulative infractions constitute a major infraction.
- B.C. Any other rule in the ASUW Finance Policy that is not explicitly defined in this table will be considered a minor infraction either a major or minor infraction, at the discretion of the SO Funding Board.

# Section 4.02 <u>Probationary Advisory Term</u>

- 1. Minor Infractions of the ASUW Finance Policy will result in the RSO being placed on an advisory termprobation. The probationary periodadvisory term for an RSO will be a full calendar year from the date of the most recent infraction. The probationary periodadvisory term shall never exceed a full year from the date of the infraction(s).
- 2. RSOs being considered for probation an advisory term will receive proper notice of their infraction(s) and will be given the opportunity to be heard in front of the RSO Funding Board regarding the alleged infraction(s) at least one week prior to formal action taking place.
  - A. Once officially placed on probation an RSO will be required to meet with the designated relevant ASUW Executive and sign an ASUW Finance Policy Violation Agreement for RSOs form outlining the terms and conditions of the probationary period advisory term. If the RSO fails to meet with the relevant ASUW Executive, the ASUW Finance Policy Violation Agreement for RSOs form will be sent to their student emails and listed Advisor or the Student Organizations and Entertainment Office.
- 3. During the probationary period, any further violation, either major or minor, of the ASUW Finance Policy will result in the temporary suspension of the RSO's ability to apply for funding through the RSO Funding Board. The length of this suspension will include one full calendar year from date of the most recent infraction, followed by <u>a</u> subsequent <u>probationary periodadvisory term</u> of one calendar year.

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- A. RSOs will have notice regarding the alleged infraction(s) while on <u>probation\_an</u> <u>advisory term</u> and an opportunity to be heard in front of the RSO Funding Board one week prior to formal action taking place.
- 4. If an RSO uses ASUW money for items explicitly disallowed by the ASUW Finance Policy, that RSO must repay those funds by the end of their probation advisory term or suspension period. If an RSO does not repay those funds, their probation period will be extended until the RSO is able to repay the funds.

## Section 4.03 <u>Suspension of Funding</u>

- 1. Major Infractions of the ASUW Finance Policy will result in the temporary suspension of the RSO's ability to apply for funding through the RSO Funding Board.
- 2. Major Infractions will mean an RSO will be ineligible to apply for funding for a full calendar year from the date the most recent infraction(s) occurred.
- 3. RSO Funding Board may request a two-thirds 2/3 standing vote of the ASUW Senate to reduce the suspension of funding for a RSO by up to half of the calendar year.
- 4. Suspension of funding may never exceed a full year from time of initial major infraction.
- 5.3. Immediately following the term of suspended funding, the RSO will be placed on probation an advisory term for a full calendar year.
- 6.4. RSOs being considered for suspension of funds will receive proper notice of their infraction(s) and will be given the opportunity to be heard in front of the RSO Funding Board and/-or ASUW Senate regarding the alleged infraction(s) at least one week prior to formal action taking place.
- 7.5.Once an RSO is officially suspended from funding, the RSO will be required to meet with the designated relevant ASUW executive and sign an ASUW Finance Policy Violation Agreement for RSOs form outlining the terms and conditions of the suspension. If the RSO fails to meet with the relevant ASUW executive, the ASUW Finance Policy Violation Agreement for RSOs form will be sent to their student emails and listed aAdvisor or the Student Organizations and Entertainment Office.
- 8.6.Once the suspension of funding period has passed the RSO will be required to meet with the designated relevant ASUW executive and sign an ASUW Finance Policy Violation Agreement for RSOs form outlining the terms and conditions of the probationary periodadvisory term. If the RSO fails to meet with the relevant ASUW executive, the ASUW Finance Policy Violation Agreement for RSOs form will be sent to their student emails and listed aAdvisor or the Student Organizations and Entertainment Office.

#### Section 4.04 General Procedure for Sanctions

- 1. The RSO Funding Board or the designated relevant ASUW Executive shall impose the suspension outlined above.
- 2. The length of a RSO's suspension of funding or probationary period must not exceed the above guidelines.
- 3.2. Additional stipulations placed on an RSO by the RSO Funding Board and/or the ASUW Senate are binding. Infractions of any additional stipulations placed on a funding request will be considered as minor infractions, unless otherwise explicitly specified by the RSO Funding Board and/or ASUW Senate at the time of placing the stipulation.
- 4.3. RSOs may appeal this suspension through the process outlined below in Article 5.
- 5.4. Any Senator may make a motion to lift or reduce the length of an RSO's advisory term or suspension, regardless of the RSO's decision to appeal. This motion requires a two-thirds (2/3) standing vote of the Senate to pass.
