1. WHEREAS, the purpose of the Associated Students of the University of Wyoming (ASUW)

2. Student Government is to serve our fellow students in the best manner possible; and,

3. WHEREAS, ex-officio members of the ASUW Senate represent multiple student groups with

4. unique interests and issues across campus; and,

5. WHEREAS, the ASUW Senate frequently votes on legislation that impacts these groups of

6. students specifically; and,

7. WHEREAS, it is currently mandated that all legislation submitted to the ASUW Senate be

8. sponsored by at least two (2) ASUW Senators; and,

9. WHEREAS, ex-officio members possess greater awareness of the needs and attitudes of the

10. niche groups they represent to the ASUW Senate; and,

11. WHEREAS, a sponsorship from an ex-officio member of the ASUW Senate carries equal

12. weight as that of an ASUW Senator.

13. THEREFORE, be it enacted by the Associated Students of the University of Wyoming

14. (ASUW) that the ASUW Rules and Procedures be modified as outlined in Addendum

15. A immediately upon passage of this bill.

Addendum A

Article 6. Legislative Action

Section 6.01 ASUW Legislative Process

1. Bills and resolutions may be submitted by any fee paying student. All bills and resolutions must be sponsored by no less than two (2) Senators or ex-officio members of the ASUW Senate as defined in Article 8, section 8.01 of the ASUW By-Laws, who are not authors, or by an ASUW standing committee. Students-at-Large, ASUW Programs or Services, and Recognized Student Organizations may also sponsor legislation. Regardless of their fee paying student status, members of the Judicial Council may not author or sponsor legislation due to their association.
