- 1. WHEREAS, the purpose of the Associated Students of the University of
- 2. Wyoming (ASUW) is to serve our fellow students in the best manner possible; and,
- 3. WHEREAS, the Wyoming Hathaway Scholarship (Hathaway) is awarded to numerous
- 4. in-state students at the University of Wyoming; and,
- 5. WHEREAS, Wyoming State Legislature HB#0028 the "Hathaway Lump Sum Merit
- 6. Scholarship" addresses three difficulties with disbursement of funds which would allow
- 7. for students to (1) start the use of their Hathaway twenty years post-graduation instead of
- 8. four years-post graduation, (2) allow students to access their Hathaway in a "lump sum",
- 9. and (3) allow for Summer and J-Term courses to count towards Hathaway's requirements
- 10. for an "academic year"; and,
- 11. WHEREAS, the first change to Hathaway would be beneficial for in-state non-
- 12. traditional students to access Hathaway twenty years after high school graduation or
- 13. receiving a General Education Degree (GED); and,
- 14. WHEREAS, the second change to Hathaway would be beneficial for in-state students to
- 15. adjust when they decided to use their Hathaway, given many first-year students have the
- 16. most expenses their first-year, as there are live-in requirements with Residence Life and
- 17. Dining for students who are not exempt from the policy; and,
- 18. WHEREAS, the third change to Hathaway would benefit in-state students who take

19. classes over the Summer and J-Term, for purposes of early graduation or economic

20. necessity; and,

21. WHEREAS, the changes to Hathaway, provided HB#0028 passes in the Wyoming State

22. Legislature, will take effect July 1, 2025.

23. THEREFORE, be it resolved that the Associated Students of the University of Wyoming

24. Student Government (ASUW) strongly supports the passage and future implementation25. of HB#0028.

For 17 credential programs of one (1) term or less, cost of 18 attendance and unmet financial need shall be calculated on 19 a projected annual basis, but the annual award amount shall be provided in full in the term of attendance, on a 20 21 prorated basis.

### Addendum B

Hathaway lump sum merit scholarship.

22LSO-0163, 1.0

#### FISCAL NOTE

This fiscal impact is indeterminable.

This bill will result in an indeterminable expenditure increase from the Hathaway Scholarship Expenditure Account and the Hathaway Scholarship Reserve Account beginning in FY 2026, due to multiple modifications to the Hathaway Scholarship Program (Program).

This bill modifies the Program by extending the timeframe an eligible student has to apply for the scholarship from four (4) years to twenty (20) years after high school graduation or the graduation date of the student's high school class if the student receives a high school equivalency certificate. The timeframe has also been extended for an eligible student to apply for the scholarship from the student's 21<sup>st</sup> to 41<sup>st</sup> birthday if the student completes a home-based educational program. This bill also modifies the Program by allowing a student to receive all or a portion of the student's remaining scholarship amount in any semester.

The bill repeals the satisfactory academic progress requirements to retain a scholarship and the eligibility requirement that a student is not eligible for a scholarship if the student has been convicted of a felony in Wyoming or another jurisdiction and has not been granted an exception by the Wyoming Department of Education.

The modifications result in an indeterminable expenditure increase due to: 1) a greater number of students eligible to participate in the Program; 2) the potential of scholarship awards being distributed earlier than current law provides; and 3) the potential of total scholarship awards increasing with the elimination of the satisfactory academic progress requirements.
