## **SENATE RESOLUTION #2795**

**TITLE:** ASUW Concern Regarding Icy Campus Sidewalks

**DATE INTRODUCED:** March 29, 2022

1. Student Government is to serve our fellow students in the best manner possible; and,

2. WHEREAS, the University of Wyoming Laramie campus receives, on average 162.56

3. centimeters (64.0 inches) of snowfall per year, has an average of 210.7 days per year in

4. which the temperature falls below freezing, and a climate analysis of Laramie notes that

5. "April is the snowiest month in Laramie with 12.1 inches of snow, and 9 months of the year

6. have significant snowfall."; and,

7. WHEREAS, this snow accumulates on sidewalks and often melts and refreezes, forming

8. dangerous patches of ice that can persist on campus sidewalks for weeks or even months at

9. a time, as exemplified by images in Addendum A; and,

10. WHEREAS, these icy sidewalks pose many challenges for students, staff, and faculty by

11. making it difficult and potentially hazardous to walk across campus; and,

12. WHEREAS, this further presents an accessibility issue for many members of our campus

13. community who have mobility struggles; and,

14. WHEREAS, as stated on the Disability Support Services website: "Physical and program

15. accessibility at the University of Wyoming is a joint responsibility and can be achived only

16. through cooperative efforts of University faculty, staff, and students"; and,

17. WHEREAS, the University of Wyoming is transitioning to emphasizing a "walking

18. campus" mentality through the creation of additional green space in what is currently the

19. parking lot in front of the Wyoming Union; and,



- 20. WHEREAS, this will make icy sidewalks potentially become an even larger challenge
- 21. for the University in the future; and,
- 22. WHEREAS, these icy sidewalks also present potential liability issues for the University;
- 23. and,
- 24. WHEREAS, there has been significant student concern over these icy sidewalks, as
- 25. demonstrated by the poll results taken from ASUW's spring 2022 student issues survey, as
- 26. shown in Addendum A; and,
- 27. WHEREAS, according to these survey results, 73.06% of students report that they either
- 28. "definitely" or "somewhat" have a problem with icy sidewalks on campus; and,
- 29. WHEREAS, when asking the question "What are some small-scale projects you
- 30. would like to see ASUW pursue?" in an open-ended format, we received 214 unique
- 31. student comments specifically asking that we address icy sidewalks on campus; and,
- 32. WHEREAS, responding to this simple student need would be a positive example of the
- 33. University of Wyoming caring for its campus community and taking proactive steps based
- 34. on campus feedback.
- 35. THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Associated Students of the University of Wyoming
- 36. (ASUW) Student Government that the ASUW urges the University of Wyoming (UW)
- 37. Administration to investigate this issue, and, if possible, take proactive steps towards
- 38. reducing the prevalence of icy sidewalks and walkways on campus; and,
- 39. THEREFORE, be it further resolved that this resolution shall be sent to the UW President,
- 40. the Executive Director of UW Operations, and the Vice President for Students Affairs; and,
- 41. THEREFORE, be it further resolved that ASUW will be open to discussing providing
- 42. financial resources to fix this problem through the ASUW Facilities Endowment.


