The SPPAIS Political Science Challenge Exam. ASUW recommends this fee be increased to \$100 instead of \$160. ASUW cites the following:

A 100% increase is a fairly large increase, especially with students under

increased financial pressure from inflation and COVID-19.

- It is not clear what role a graduate student plays in the proctoring of this exam, as previously students in ASUW who have taken it report that they took it wholly online without a proctor. Additionally, the administration of one exam likely does not constitute an entire job for a graduate student.
- At least one of these exams, the Wyoming Government Exam, provides credit equivalent to a one-credit hour class. The per-credit hour rate for in-state students is \$160. Paying the same amount for a one-hour exam as for an entire semester course is not practical or reasonable.

- This is an extremely large increase, especially considering these rates were increased in FY 2023 as well.
- <u>Under no circumstances should a 15% increase be approved; this is</u> astronomically high and far above the rate of inflation.
- At most, this fee increase should match the rate of inflation, which is currently at 7.75% as of October 2022.
- Students are also suffering under inflation, and these massive increases to housing costs will directly harm students.

#### Addendum B

### The ASUW Tuition Allocation and Student Fee Review Committee voted to

- The ASUW Student Fee Review Committee voted to maintain the current ASUW student fee. The committee and ASUW will evaluate the ASUW fee in Spring 2023 to seek to continually maximize student benefit and determine how to most benefit students.
- The ASUW Student Fee Review Committee voted to maintain the current Consolidated Student Services student fee due to no request for change and acceptable usage of the fee.
- The ASUW Student Fee Review Committee voted to approve a portion of the increase to the Intercollegiate Athletics student fee. The committee decided not to approve \$1.50 which would have been allocated to meals.
- The ASUW Student Fee Review Committee voted to approve the increase to Transportation fee. The committee determined the fee increase is necessary for the university to improve transportation, an ongoing concern for students.
- The ASUW Student Fee Review Committee voted to maintain the current Recycling student fee due no request for change and acceptable usage of the fee.
- The ASUW Student Fee Review Committee voted to maintain the current Student Media student fee due no request for change. The committee will evaluate Student Media fee in Spring 2023 to see ways to improve the fee.
- The ASUW Student Fee Review Committee voted to maintain the current Education Aboard student fee due no request for change and acceptable usage of the fee.
- The ASUW Student Fee Review Committee voted to maintain the current Music and Theatre student fee due no request for change and acceptable usage of the fee.
- The ASUW Student Fee Review Committee voted to approve a portion of the increase to the ACES student fee. Advising is important on campus and the committee agrees that it needs improved. However, we are concerned that ACES is making a 50% increase instead on increasing the student fee in small amounts.
- The ASUW Student Fee Review Committee voted to recommend a decrease to the Onboarding student fee. After reflection on the Saddle Up program in 2022, the committee decided that due to feedback from students we should recommend a decrease to the fee and recommend that the university consider restructuring the Saddle Up program.

- The ASUW Student Fee Review Committee voted to recommend a decrease to the Student Success student fee. After reflecting on the Cowboy Coaches program, the committee determined that the student fee should be decreased based on the low usefulness and effectiveness of the program.
- The ASUW Student Fee Review Committee voted to maintain the current Degree Completion student fee due no request for change and acceptable usage of the fee.
- The ASUW Student Fee Review Committee voted to approve a portion of the increase to the Distance Students student fee. Advising is important on campus and the committee agrees that it needs improved. However, we are concerned that the Distance Students fee is making a 50% increase instead on increasing the student fee in small amounts.
- The ASUW Student Fee Review Committee voted to maintain the current Prision Education student fee. The committee is excited to see want comes from this new program on campus.
