TITLE: Limiting Inflation of Sponsorship Lists
DATE INTRODUCED: 10/31/2025
AUTHOR: Chief of Legislative Affairs Heffley
SPONSORS: Senators Robinson and Hansen, Director of Student Organizations Elwood

1. WHEREAS, the purpose of the Associated Students of the University of Wyoming
2. (ASUW) is to serve our fellow students in the best manner possible; and,
3. WHEREAS, current sponsorship requirements have no distinction between committee
4. sponsorships and individual senator sponsorships; and,
5. WHEREAS, this lack of distinction creates inflated sponsorship lists where a senator
6. can be listed as an individual sponsor while serving on a standing committee that is
7. sponsoring the same piece of legislation; and,
8. WHEREAS, a standing committee sponsorship fulfills the complete sponsorship
9. requirement, leaving the additional individual sponsorships to be extraneous.
10. THEREFORE, be it enacted by the Associated Students of the University of
11. Wyoming (ASUW) Student Government that this distinction is clarified in Section
12. 6.01 Subsection 1 of the ASUW Rules and Procedures as seen in Addendum A; and,
13. THEREFORE, be it further enacted that these changes take place immediately upon
14. passage of this legislation.

Addendum A

Section 6.01 ASUW Legislative Process

1. Bills and resolutions may be submitted by any fee-paying student. All bills and resolutions must be sponsored by no less than two (2) Senators, two (2) ex-officio members of the ASUW Senate (who are not authors), or by an ASUW standing committee. Executives, Students-at-Large, ASUW Programs or Services, and Recognized Student Organizations may also sponsor legislation; these sponsorships, however, are unofficial and do not contribute to the sponsorships needed to steer a piece of legislation. Regardless of their fee-paying student status, members of the Judicial Council may not author or sponsor legislation due to their association. Pro Staff may not sponsor legislation in the interest of avoiding professional bias.
 - a. Senators, Ex-Officios, or Executives that sit on a sponsoring ASUW standing committee cannot be listed as an individual sponsor.
