**TITLE:** ASUW Special Projects Approval FY26  
**DATE INTRODUCED:** 11/14/2025

**SPONSORS:** Senator Hansen, Chief of Staff Hargett, Budget and Planning Committee

1. WHEREAS, the purpose of the Associated Students of the University of Wyoming
2. (ASUW) is to serve our fellow students in the best manner possible; and,
3. WHEREAS, the ASUW Student Government allocated \$80,000 from endowed funds to
4. be expended in Fiscal Year 2026 (FY26) pursuant to the ASUW Special Projects
5. Endowment and its governing language; and,
6. WHEREAS, the Special Projects Endowment Agreement and the ASUW Budget and
7. Planning Finance Policy require that all funded projects must abide by the following
8. criteria: 1) the project must benefit a large population of students; 2) the project must be
9. of long-lasting benefit; 3) ASUW money cannot fund research, salaries,
10. classroom/academic projects; 4) ASUW money cannot fund general operating expenses
11. or travel/conference expenses; 5) the funds must be expended by April 30<sup>th</sup>, 2026, or
12. funds will be forfeited; 6) requests must not exceed \$60,000; and 7) after the purchase is
13. made, all future maintenance, inventory, and documentation is the responsibility of the
14. Applicant/College/Department; and,
15. WHEREAS, throughout this semester the ASUW Budget and Planning (B&P)
16. Committee has conducted a thorough process to receive applications, review and
17. assess the viability of each, determine which proposals meet the specific guidelines set

18. forth, and then deliberated as to determine how to maximize the impact of ASUW's  
19. student fee dollars; and,  
20. WHEREAS, the committee received eighteen (18) applications totaling \$326,674.68 in  
21. requested special project funding; and,  
22. WHEREAS, the committee determined eleven (11) out of the eighteen (18)  
23. total applications were eligible for full or partial special projects funding; and,  
24. WHEREAS, the committee deliberated each request in depth and approved an amount  
25. totaling \$80,358.22 allocated across each project request as seen in Addendum A; and,  
26. WHEREAS, all applicants had the opportunity to appeal the committee's decisions and  
27. no revisions were made; and,  
28. WHEREAS, the B&P Finance Policy requires that special project allocations and  
29. announcements thereof must be made prior to the end of the fall semester; and,  
30. WHEREAS, the committee's rationale, funding breakdown, and a brief explanation of  
31. each request is outlined in Addendum A.  
32. THEREFORE, be it enacted by the Associated Students of the University of  
33. Wyoming (ASUW) Student Government that an amount totaling of \$80,358.22 be  
34. allocated across eleven (11) projects from the ASUW Special Projects Endowment,  
35. according to the overall breakdown seen in Addendum A; and,  
36. THEREFORE, be it enacted that this legislation takes effect immediately upon the  
37. passage of this bill.

**Applicant: Air Force ROTC**

Using the funds, the organization will purchase a high-quality, durable camera and related equipment that will provide lasting value for years to come. The materials will be used to capture key moments such as training exercises, leadership events, formal ceremonies, and other important activities, directly supporting long-term program success and recruiting efforts. With the enhanced capability to produce professional-grade content, Detachment 940 will be able to effectively showcase what is expected of cadets, highlight their achievements, and share the AFROTC experience through social media and other platforms to engage and attract future cadets. ~ Request Excerpt

**B&P Decision: Denied.** The committee elected to deny this project due to its inward-facing nature, raising questions over its true benefit to students. This project was supplemented with additional funding from the ASUW operating budget.

**Applicant: ASUW Director of Wellness**

“The Reboot Kits are intended for distribution at events to provide immediate and practical support to recipients. These kits focus on hydration, minor injury care, and comfort, contributing to physical well-being and preparedness. ~Request Excerpt

**B&P Decision: Denied.** The committee has elected to deny this project due to concerns regarding the long-term efficacy of this project. The endowment language states, “the project must be of long-lasting benefit” and the committee is unsure if this project fulfills this criterion. Additionally, there are funding concerns for the reusable and branded nature of some of the requested items. This project was supplemented with additional funding from the ASUW operating budget.

**Applicant: Campus Recreation Outdoor Program**

We believe these tools would allow us to better accommodate students and introduce the positive effects of the outdoors to everyone. All of these items would be available for use on trips or available to be checked out by individuals for their own personal recreation. A principal goal of the Outdoor Program is to provide accessible gear rentals and meaningful experiences to the student population.” ~Request Excerpt

**B&P Decision: Amended.** The committee cut the indoor climbing holds from the request, bringing the total to \$6471.29. This was because of the applicant's desire for other items to be funded before the indoor climbing holds, and the committee believed that other items benefited students more.



**Applicant: Campus Recreation A**

Each semester, Half Acre Recreation and Wellness center welcomes over 6,000 unique users and we record about 110,000 swipe-ins each semester. Historically, ASUW has been very generous in awarding Campus Recreation funding for high-quality fitness equipment. We are very grateful, and our students appreciate the new pieces that arrive. This volume of users is utilizing our weight equipment, attending group exercise classes, participating in intramural sport offerings, utilizing our Outdoor Program, and much more.

This request is for two free-standing, portable slackline systems (\$539 each), SlackRack Fitness Slackline, which would be available for open recreational use at Half Acre Recreation and Wellness Center. If awarded, one would be placed in the newly renovated Functional Fitness Space (first priority), and the other would go on the third floor in a supplemental weight lifting/stretching area (second priority).

Slacklining is a popular activity that involves balancing on a length of a 1-2" wide strap secured between two anchor points, usually 2-3 feet off the ground. This is often done outside where trees serve as anchor points. Currently, UW does not allow slacklining between any trees on campus because of the risk of damage to the trees, but neither does UW offer any designated space for this activity. ~ Request Excerpt

**B&P Decision: Amended.** The committee decided that while the project had good merit, there would not be sufficient demand for two slacklines. There was also concern expressed over finding space for both pieces of equipment.

**Applicant: Campus Recreation B**

“This request is for two TANK™ MX3 sleds, which is a unique 3-wheeled sled design that compliments the two 4-wheeled TANKS we currently have. The TANK MX3 delivers scalable resistance settings, a digital display screen of power output and distance, and the three wheeled design can be driven in different directions, giving users a multi-dimensional form of sled resistance. Our 4-wheeled TANKS can only be driven forward and backward and are cumbersome to turn. The pivoting wheels on the TANK MX3 is a step up in innovation and are engineered to meet the demands of high-traffic facilities, by combining durability, performance, and versatility. Users will be excited to have more TANKS available with this design offering something extra special

**Applicant: Wyoming Motorsports Club**

This year, Wyoming Motorsports has seen the highest member retention and interest in the history of the organization. For the upcoming year, the overarching goal is to grow the organization further, allowing Wyoming Motorsports to benefit as many students as possible throughout the University. Part of how this targeted growth will be achieved is through the lessons learned from the Baja competition and how we can apply those lessons to the entire club for years to come. Wyoming Motorsports is dedicated to the longevity of the organization as well as its existing relationships with the University of Wyoming and adjacent entities. Wyoming Motorsports will continue to set up any student for success who is willing to dedicate time to experience the lessons and hard work involved in working on a racing team.

The items requested this year serve the longevity of the club and its ability to help as many students as possible reach their fullest potential. Each item listed will last a minimum of three years, enriching the experience of students in multiple classes, with some items intended to last a decade or more. Many tools we need for competition-ready cars to work are the personal possessions of current members which will not continue to work for very long. None of these items are single-use, and all will directly enhance the learning experience for students, elevate the quality of work showcased by UWyo students, and continue to display excellence on the national collegiate stage. Seeing new members' enthusiasm and grit this year proves these

**B&P Decision: Amended.** The committee was impressed with the thoroughness of this organization's presentation, and with their explanation of the student's impact. After discussions at the divisional level, the committee concluded that it could not fund the flat top car hauler due to concerns of recurring and unforeseen expenses. The rest of the project was funded in full.

**Applicant: Campus Recreation Wellness Center**

“The Wellness Center would like to purchase a new/additional smoothie bike. Our smoothie bike events are usually very well attended, and we offer outreaches that allow other UW departments to request the bike. We have partnered with ASUW, the Honors College, UW Libraries, the Art Museum, and others to bring the smoothie bike to their spaces and events. We’ve had the bike at events where hundreds of students are in attendance. Our current bike works however we're finding that the events the smoothie bike is at are getting larger and it would be much more efficient to have two bikes and would allow more students to engage in the activity. It would also allow us to offer more smoothie varieties at the same time (which is very helpful when considering alternatives when someone has dietary allergies or restrictions).” ~ Request Excerpt

**B&P Decision: Approved.**

**Applicant: College of College of Agriculture, Life Sciences and Natural Resources**  
**(Extension)**

“The funding will be used to transform what is currently an empty, unused room into a fully functional space equipped with fresh paint, comfortable and flexible furniture, and updated technology to support meetings, training, and virtual collaboration. Without this funding, we would be forced to complete the renovation in stages, significantly delaying the space’s availability and impact.

By creating a vibrant and functional hub, we aim to re-launch the Collegiate 4-H Program with renewed energy and purpose. The renovated area will provide a welcoming environment where students can meet regularly, host events, receive mentorship, and maintain the strong sense of belonging they’ve developed through their county 4-H experiences.

Grant funding will allow us to create a soft-landing space for youth transitioning to college life, support their continued leadership development, and build a stronger, more connected 4-H community at the University of Wyoming” ~Request Excerpt

**B&P Decision: Denied.** The committee decided that this project did not directly benefit a sufficient number of students. There were also concerns about the existence of collegiate 4-H at the University, and the room being used for ulterior purposes outside of the intent of the project.

**Applicant: Cowboy Robotics Student Organization**

“We are requesting \$8,800 to purchase tools and materials for our lab. Our in-house capabilities are very limited; we only have access to a small tool bag filled with hand tools donated by members or purchased by the club. Previous discussions with the university’s machine shop have revealed that we hold lowest priority with stipulations that any request for significant parts would take 1-2 months if ordered at the beginning of the year. Because of this, we are forced to rely on third party manufacturers for every part. This adds confusion to the design process, severely limits our capabilities, and greatly increases turn-around times. This does not work on a competition timetable. Our goal is to establish manufacturing ability on par with Wyoming Motorsports, allowing us to design, build, and test parts at an accelerated pace. This would let us get much bolder and more iterative with our solutions, leading to better end products and a richer engineering experience for all involved.” ~Request Excerpt

**B&P Decision: Approved.** After conversations at the divisional level, the committee determined that this project was feasible. It is a good project that will directly benefit from providing experiential learning for a wide variety of students.

**Applicant: UWIN Makerspace**

“The University of Wyoming Innovation Network (UWIN) makerspaces are among the most heavily used student resources on campus, with over 1,645 3D printer bookings, 199 laser/CNC bookings, and 17,534 total patrons served across all spaces in the past year. These tools are not only used for individual projects but also support major student programs such as Dome After Dark, Coe Creators, Celebrate & Create, and Maker Match Night, collectively engaging hundreds of students in hands-on innovation and community building. With ASUW’s support, this proposal will restore critical laser cutting capabilities, expand our 3D printing fleet to meet daily demand, and introduce reliable CNC machining. These upgrades ensure that both individual users and large classroom groups have access to the technologies that fuel creativity, research, and entrepreneurship across disciplines.” ~Request Excerpt

**B&P Decision: Amended.** The committee saw the value in partially funding this project. It was noted that the makerspace is overutilized and underfunded, and this project will help alleviate these concerns. This project was supplemented with additional funding from the ASUW operating budget.

**Applicant: Department of Music**

“Modern composers use a wide palette of sounds in their compositions and one that has become much more prominent is the contrabass clarinet. This instrument provides an extremely low sound to the music that is unique and powerful. Currently the University of Wyoming does not own a contrabass clarinet, so we are unable to accurately perform as conceived by many composers. With this instrument, UW can not only be on par with other leading musical institutions around the country, it will provide a new level of nuance and sound for the enjoyment of audiences for years to come.” ~ Request Excerpt

**B&P Decision: Denied.** The committee determined that this project did not benefit a wide array of students. Additionally, during the hearing, the committee was made aware of a \$15,000 grant that was received by the department; that could be used to buy a plastic version of this instrument.

**Applicant: University of Wyoming Information Technology**

“Information Technology currently operates a device checkout program, allowing students to borrow laptops and tablets for up to a semester at a time. This program is available to any enrolled student at the University of Wyoming, regardless of major. The current inventory of devices includes 600 PC laptops, 152 Mac Laptops, and 98 iPads. Currently, all of the iPads are checked out, and there are 87 PC laptops, and 14 Mac laptops available. This past year, we have seen a rise in demand for iPads in our checkout program, and this request is being submitted to help expand our pool of available devices to help meet the demand.” ~ Request Excerpt

**Applicant: Non-Traditional Student Council**

There would be a purchase of two griddles. One 36” griddle with no hardtop hood, plus the cover that goes along with it. We also are requesting for the purchase griddle seasoning & cast iron conditioner to help the griddles last longer and operate more efficiently. Blackstone is also including a 30 piece Accessory Kit with the purchase of the 28” griddle. I have included two different funding projections below because Blackstone is doing a discount on the griddles. I have included the original price and the discounted price for your committee to take into consideration. As for the propane to operate the griddles, that would be funded through the current NTSC operating budget or the SOFB budget since that would be a reoccurring purchase. Propane tanks must be rented for one time use and returned same day to the retail store that the propane was rented from, as the policy will be that propane tanks cannot be stored with the griddles.”

**B&P Decision: Denied.** The committee was informed by both the Directors of Student Organizations and the chair of SOFB that they were not in discussions surrounding the potential rental use of these griddles to student organizations. Additionally, the committee was concerned about the plan for storage and upkeep of these griddles.

**Applicant: Western Thunder Marching Band**

“The Western Thunder Marching Band has seen tremendous growth in recent years. Following our internationally televised performance at the 2025 Tournament of Roses Parade, the band now includes 240 members—the largest in school history. Unfortunately, our current uniform inventory cannot accommodate this increase in membership. Our staff has spent the offseason altering uniforms to try to fit 240 members into 250 uniforms. With size considerations, this was a miracle for the 2025 season but it’s not sustainable. Our current uniforms, purchased in 2012, have served us well for over a decade but are now showing significant wear. The wool material requires dry cleaning and are only cleaned once per year, contributing to their deterioration. Additionally, the current design features a block UW logo that is no longer consistent with the University’s official branding. The new uniforms will proudly feature the iconic Wyoming “Steamboat” logo, unifying our appearance with the rest of UW Athletics and Institutional Marketing. We are in the process of getting designs and prices from different uniform companies. Based on the cost of our current uniforms, we are expecting the uniforms to be about \$700 per uniform. That includes the bib style pants, the jacket with custom embroidery and patches and logos.” ~ Request Excerpt

Amount Requested- \$60,000 for a portion of new uniforms

**B&P Decision: Denied.** While this project had significant merit, the committee decided to advocate for a change in funding structures at the athletics level, rather than funding the project due to the large cost associated with it. This project was supplemented with additional funding from the ASUW operating budget.



**Applicant: Violence Prevention Center**

“By having an interactive, mobile, whiteboard, not only are we able to have the necessary means to provide technology to these spaces to present our educational programs, but we can also add more video, sound, and even whiteboard technology to the interactive programs. This will be helpful with many of our upgraded presentations that use media. We also see opportunities to use this technology during our tabling events to provide more technology-based activities, and to enhance some of our more popular events such as Not Your Nana’s Bingo, Trivia After Dark, and our Watch Parties. We would also incorporate it for use in our outreach programs such as Love Better Store and Denim Day. The interactive whiteboard would also provide us with flexibility to provide programs in the Skylight Lounge or the Fireplace Lounge. If we only used this board for the examples we provided, we would have reached somewhere between 2,500 – 3,500 students last year. This technology would also be an eventual cost-saving investment, making expensive chart paper and stands unnecessary. ~ Request Excerpts

**B&P Decision: Approved.**

**Applicant: University of Wyoming Union**

The proposed new chargers, Supernova, is both portable and automated. The convenience of this being located in the Wyoming Union could boost our foot traffic and use of the space. More importantly, it offers convenience to students. They are able to grab an electron, take it to class or keep it with them while eating in the Union or while they are in a meeting in the building, then return it when they are finished. There will be no more searching or waiting for an open outlet. They can increase productivity as well as safety and security. There are advertising and branding opportunities, too. These are accessible to everyone and environmentally friendly. We propose to install three new Supernovas on a wall near the West entrance. This location sees heavy foot-traffic and would offer chargers to students as they head to class. We can track the Electrons by requiring a name and phone number at the time to check-out which also builds in safety to not lose the Electron. **BNP Decision: Amended.** The committee elected to only fund two chargers because of the usage numbers that were provided for the existing chargers. The committee cannot fund the \$900 for the replacement chargers because of the stipulation in the original FY24 funding that noted B&P is not responsible for any replacement costs associated with these chargers.

**Applicant: University of Wyoming Game Room A**

“We propose to get a new storage cabinet / desk for the game room so that we can properly store the equipment we check out in the Game Room. The current desk is not built to store the equipment we have and has caused many problems. We cannot store all the equipment the way we need to with our current desk. The current desk is a make-shift cabinet, that was cut in half and has been at the Game Room for over 20 years. This desk/cabinet was not built to take the daily wear and tear that a public-facing desk should, so we have had multiple drawers and locks break, and shelves go out of commission.” ~ Request Excerpt

While the Game Room is averaging high numbers so far this semester, this has left some visitors unable to check out equipment due to someone else already playing. With the growing number of visitors to Pokes Pub, especially during busy hours, we are not currently offering enough variety of games to keep up with this growing student need. Adding in a Skee-Ball game will give students another fun game to check out and play in the Game Room. Skee-Ball will be another way for students to relax during classes and enjoy time with friends while taking a break from studying.”
