

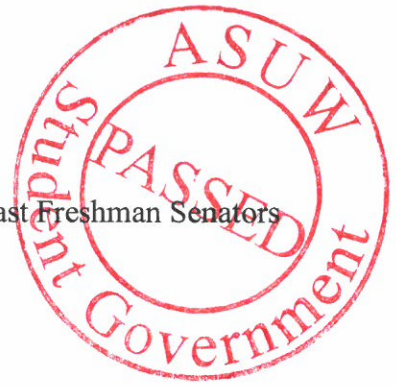
Freshman Senate Resolution #36

5. experience from their time in the ASUW Freshman Senate that could be beneficial for
6. newly appointed Freshman Senators; and,
7. WHEREAS, newly appointed Freshman Senators would benefit from the teachings and
8. advice of previous Freshman Senators; and,
9. WHEREAS, there is a traditional retreat each year for the newly appointed Freshman
10. Senators, solely organized by the Freshman Senate Advisor or Dean of Students
11. Designee; and
12. WHEREAS, this retreat introduces newly appointed senators to their peers within the
13. Freshman Senate and the processes of the ASUW; and,
14. WHEREAS, this retreat presents a great opportunity to learn parliamentary processes
15. and gain a better understanding of the commitment and purpose surrounding the ASUW
16. Freshman Senate.
17. THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Freshman Senate of the Associated Students of the
18. University of Wyoming (ASUW) that the previous year's senators, specifically but not

19. limited to the chairs of each committee, are incorporated into the following

20. year's Freshman Senate Retreat; and,

21. THEREFORE, be it further resolved that the previous senators provide advice and

22. consultation to current Freshman Senators, and help lead Retreat activities that will better

23. prepare current Freshman Senators for parliamentary and ASUW processes.
