


# WYOMING SUMMER

## NOTCHES HIGH TEMPS, LOW PRECIPITATION



Wyoming experienced its tenth warmest and seventh driest June-August in the 122 years data have been collected!

The October-December temperature outlook for Wyoming shows a 30-50 percent probability the state will experience above normal temperatures – with the lowest probability in the northeast corner.

The seasonal precipitation outlook shows an equal chance of above, below, or normal precipitation, with the exception of the very northern swath of the state, where there's a 30-percent probability of above-normal precipitation.
