## **Required Conditions Resulting from Environmental Review**

These required conditions are taken from the environmental report conducted by FEMA and its partners. These must be followed during any activities for the funds being spent.

## • ESA Conditions Required

- 1. All local guidelines and Wyoming Forestry Best Management Practices must be followed.
- 2. During herbicide application, a buffer of 300 feet must be implemented around all water resources, adjacent property, and recreation sites. Herbicide applicators must meet the licensing and competency standards set by state regulation.

# • MBTA Conditions Required

- O 1. All project activities must be completed using hand tools and/or low impact machinery/equipment that limit associated ground disturbance to surface soils only, such as ATVs or pick-up trucks (one-ton or smaller, with rubber tires).
- o 2. All grass seeding shall occur by hand using racks and grass seeders.
- o 3. Work must be completed when soils are dry.
- o 4. If larger equipment is required, it must be confined to existing roads
- 5. In the event that previously unknown historic resources are uncovered during project construction, work must be halted, and FEMA and the WY SHPO notified immediately.

# • SAQ Conditions Required

o For the burning of small slash piles or cut material, the applicant must comply with state regulations relating to smoke management (Wyoming Administrative Rules [WAR] 020.0002.10.04052005). Under the states air quality regulations for smoke management, burners are required to register large-scale burns with the Air Quality Division (AQD) and obtain burn identification from AQD prior to conducting burns. The state defines large scale as slash pile burns, broadcast burns, and wildland fires generating more than 0.25 tons of PM10 per day. Small-scale burns (vegetative and non-vegetative burning with less than 0.25 tons of PM10 per day) are also regulated by the AQD Open Burning Program. Burners must also register small-scale burns and obtain a burn permit from AQD prior to conducting burns. The Open Burning Program places restrictions on the burning of refuse material, trade wastes, vegetative material, and on fire hazards and firefighting operations.

# • SW&S Conditions Required

 For noxious weed management, obtain approvals from county weed districts in accordance with the Wyoming Weed and Pest Control Act. Use seed mixes that do not contain any noxious weeds designated through the Wyoming Weed and Pest Control Act.
