Introduction

The Medicine Bow Routt National Forest & Thunder Basin National Grassland will soon begin filling multiple temporary biological technician positions for the 2016 field season. Openings are available at the **GS-7**, **GS-6**, **GS-5**, **GS-4** and **GS-3** levels.

These are **TEMPORARY SEASONAL** biological science technician positions with a maximum six month tour schedule (NTE 1039 hrs.). The anticipated start dates are generally late May. The duty station for the GS 7 position is at Steamboat Springs, CO, the GS 5 positions are located in Saratoga, WY, Steamboat Springs, CO, and at Walden, CO; the GS 4 positions are at all five Ranger Districts in Douglas, WY, Laramie, WY, Saratoga, WY, Walden, CO, and at Steamboat Springs, CO; the GS-3 positions are at Douglas and Saratoga, WY. Housing will be available at Walden, Saratoga, and Steamboat Springs. Housing arrangements are in process for Douglas, and Laramie, WY. Positions will be full-time (40+hours/week).

Summary of Position

Primary responsibilities include:

- Conducting surveys, including raptors, fish, and plants, depending on position
- Documentation and report writing
- Driving to Forest Service lands and hiking to field locations, sometimes including overnight camping
- Performing miscellaneous tasks as needed including fence repair, clearing roads, weed spraying, etc.
- Conducting additional surveys for various wildlife, fish, and plant species and evaluating habitats

If selected, candidates will be expected to work a flex schedule that may include shifts up to 11.5 hours. Selected individuals should be prepared and will be expected to work in inclement weather and other adverse conditions.

Candidates must be capable of walking over 10 miles per shift on steep terrain at high elevations. Candidates must also have excellent hearing ability with or without assistive devices.
