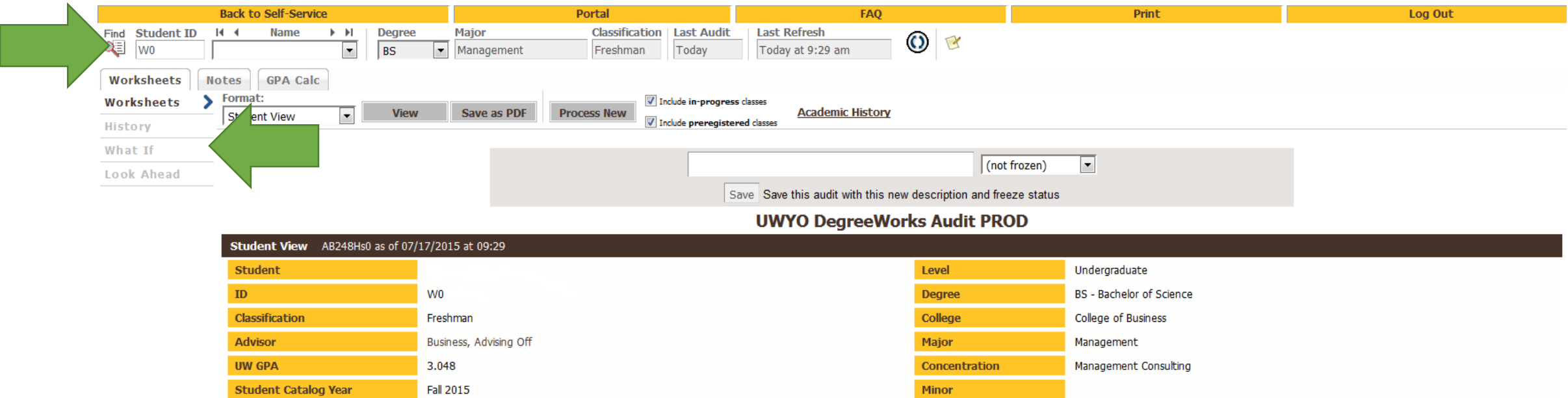

- The College of Business has a unique Advanced Business Standing (ABS) requirement in order to graduate as demonstrated in this block. There are three components to the ABS, all of which are also found on the ABS Agreement form signed by COB degree-seeking students:
 - Each of the courses or their equivalents must be completed with a grade of “C” or better in each (not C-).
 - Required 2.50 cumulative GPA or 2.50 transfer GPA. There are no exceptions to this rule.
 - 60 earned hours or junior class standing.
 - ABS is a primary prerequisite for the majority of our 3000/4000 (Jr/Sr) level courses.
- Note: Transfer grades are not counted in the UW GPA. The 2.50 transfer GPA is only used for awarding ABS.
