THE PROGRAM OF STUDY FOR THE UNDERGRADUATE MAJOR IN FINANCE

Coursework prescribed to complete the Finance major is designed to provide the student with a strong understanding of how financial decisions are made and used within business. The coursework is applicable not only to students wishing to understand the financial management of business concerns, but also to students who might consider careers in government or the non-profit sector, or those who wish to someday become entrepreneurs. The curriculum is also structured to allow preparation for graduate school by appropriate selection of courses. Students may choose to specialize in banking management, corporate finance, or investment management or to choose subjects among these tracks. Since financial markets are subject to economic principles, and because good financial decision-making is based on a sound understanding of financial information, students choosing this major study accounting and economics in addition to their finance courses.
