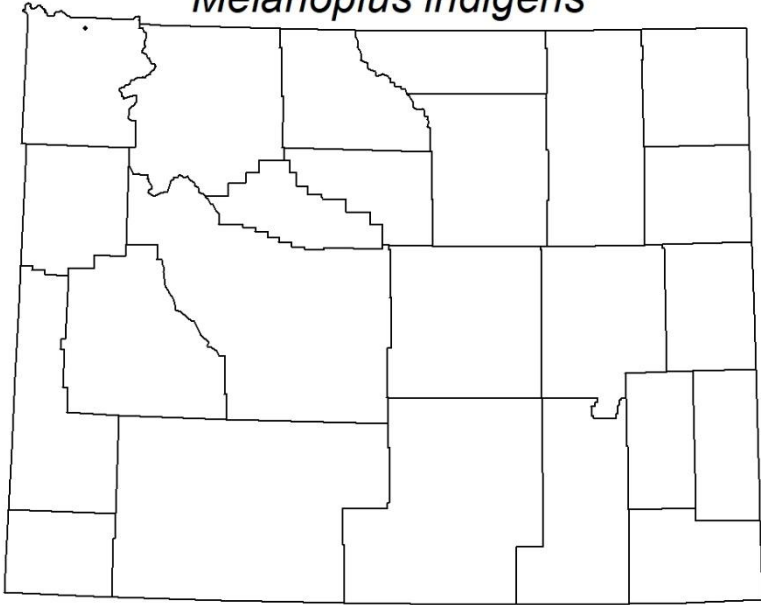


Melanoplus indigenus



Melanoplus indigenus has only been collected once in Wyoming. In the 2009 survey, a special trip was made to Yellowstone National Park. The short winged adult male was collected in late August. The specimen was collected in a sagebrush draw with pines close at an elevation of 7000 feet. *M. indigenus* is closely related to *M. oregonensis* and *M. marshalli*. Because of its limited distribution, it causes no economic damage in Wyoming.
