

*Xanthippus montanus* is a less common relative of *X. corallipes*. It is often associated with sandy soils or sagebrush grasslands, and should be found in suitable habitat throughout Wyoming. This grasshopper is reported to have a two-year life cycle, with eggs and nymphs overwintering. Adults were collected from late April through August. It is probably a grass feeder but due to scarcity it is not considered a pest grasshopper in Wyoming.
