

SPRING 2025 PROGRAM UPDATE

The Construction Management (CM) program continues to grow and flourish with the generous support of industry partners. The program currently has a total of 199 enrolled students. This semester, we graduated 40 seniors, all of whom secured full-time employment. The inaugural Industry Advisory Board was launched, consisting of 12 board members.



AGC - \$50,000

Kiewit Infrastructure's Michael Svoboda won the inaugural Bowen Prize for Great Builders from the Associated General Contractors of America in recognition of his field leadership during the construction of Nashville's new Broadway Bridge. 


CONSTRUCTION BROTHER TROUBLE

ABOVE AVERAGE NATIONALLY

Senior students are required to sit for the AIC certificate exam, an 8-hour test that assesses their construction knowledge across eight sector categories. The 2025 CM capstone class scored 7.3% above the AIC national average and also exceeded the average in each of the nine tested topical content categories.
