

Division Strategic Plan AY 2022 Executive Summary and Progress Report

Executive Summary:

This marks the final year of our "Breaking Through" strategic plan and the associated objectives outlined below. Over the past six years, the Division of Communication Disorders has demonstrated notable progress in all facets of our strategic plan. Research activities have experienced growth, evident through substantial increases in grant submissions and effective stewardship of grants. The preparation of "practice-ready" students has also shown improvement, as seen in the increased and consistently maintained enrollment of graduate students gaining telehealth experiences and a greater number of undergraduates gaining initial clinical experiences via observation. The faculty has played a pivotal role in developing and sustaining enhanced learning opportunities, encompassing Interprofessional Education/Practice (IPE/IPP), telehealth, rural health, and clinical simulation, for students across the curriculum. Furthermore, the Division has effectively sustained and expanded American Sign Language enrollment, including the introduction of a new certificate program in American Sign Language Studies. Faculty offerings of professional development has also grown substantially.
