**\*SoTL Planning for Failure Workshop | Thursday, November 18 | 9:30-10:30 am** - Let's plan ahead for the possible bumps in the road! We will also focus on the importance of adequate planning and the opportunity to be proactive when engaging with SoTL research.

Alec Muthig, Information Technology Trainer & Program Manager, will cover Qualtrics access and navigation, training and help resources, integration into Canvas (WyoCourses), embedding forms into Microsoft Teams, and provide an opportunity for SoTL project specific questions in this workshop.

**SoTL IRB Workshop | Friday, November 19 | 1:30-2:30 pm** - When designing your SoTL project, considering the IRB process is a great place to start! Nichole Person will host a workshop focused on the Institutional Review Board (IRB) at the University of Wyoming. Come learn about the history of IRB, composition of the IRB at UW, IRB contacts, processes, and more.

**\*SoTL Consultations: Designing the SoTL Study** - Come visit with the ECTL staff for drop-in SoTL consultations. Receive one-on-one support to help you design your SoTL project. Are you interested in the Scholarship of Teaching and Learning (SoTL)? Want to learn more about SoTL research questions, designing a SoTL research project, and sharing your work? Apply for the ECTL SoTL Book Club for Fall Semester 2021 to engage in a 3-part book discussion focused on Engaging in the Scholarship of Teaching and Learning (Bishop-Clark and Dietz-Uhler, 2012). This book discussion group will kick-off our Fall 2021 SoTL Cohort (see below).

Successful applicants will receive a copy of the book and will be assigned to one of the following groups based on selection. If both dates and times work for you, select both options when you apply and we will assign you to one of the groups. You can choose to attend in-person or via Zoom.

To be eligible for the Fall 2021 SoTL Cohort individuals must apply for and participate in all three SoTL Book Club sessions in Fall 2021 and meet the expectations outlined below. The SoTL Cohort will have opportunities to engage with ECTL staff on a number of occasions to discuss their research and receive assistance to support their SoTL work.

Cohort members must meet the following expectations to be eligible for a small stipend (amount pending funding) to be paid in Spring 2022:

Expectations:

1. **Book Discussion** – Attend ALL sessions in the 3-part book discussion based on the book Engaging in the Scholarship of Teaching and Learning (Bishop-Clark and Dietz-Uhle, 2012) – see above.
2. **Attend 2 of 3 Fall SoTL Events denoted above with\*** – SoTL Planning for Failure, SoTL Wonder Session, and/or SoTL Consultation-Designing the SoTL Study. These workshops/sessions take place after the book discussions have concluded and focus on assisting individuals in framing a SoTL research question and designing their SoTL project.
3. **Submit a SoTL Research Abstract (deadline: April 20, 2022)** – Cohort members will work on their projects in the spring semester with the expectation of meeting this deadline.
