Guest Facilitators	Phase 3: Spring 2020 (\$500 Stipend-June 2020) Participants will share their research at a campus-wide symposium, along with other UW faculty learning communities involved in SoTL. Awards will be given at this event which may be in the form of a monetary award, material resources and/or professional development funds. We have invited two leading experts in the field of SoTL to facilitate this year's summer institute: Nancy Chick and Peter Felten.
