

So say, Peter Felten and Leo Lambert, (2020) authors of *Relationship-Rich Education: How Human Connections Drive Success in College*. Certainly, preparing students to meet the challenges of the 21st century workplace is a key objective of the academy, but so too is "prompting students to think critically and expansively about themselves, their communities, and their world" (p.16). "Relationships," Felten and Lambert argue, "are a flexible and adaptable approach to meeting the needs of diverse students" (p. 12).
