Statewide delivery of the Elementary Education Degree Program, with an emphasis in Early Childhood

This program will deliver the final two years of the Elementary Education (ELEM) degree, with an emphasis in Early Childhood Education, over a three-year period to provide flexibility for non-traditional students who may have family or employment responsibilities in addition to their academic work.

A fall 2010 start date is planned for the next cohort, with program completion in spring 2013.

The University of Wyoming and the Wyoming community colleges share a commitment to preparing the best teachers for students in Wyoming schools. This program is focused on two critical needs—the preparation of elementary education teachers and educational access for Wyoming site-bound students.

Bringing students together for such a program is feasible only if a common starting point can be determined, with a common schedule for all students in the program. As a result, this program will operate as a cohort, meaning students will be required to take all of the courses as a group according to the program schedule.

TUITION AND FEES

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- Students begin the ELEM program with a completed Associate of Arts (A.A.) degree, and the following courses must be completed:
- ITEC 2360 (or equivalent)
- EDST 2450 (or equivalent)
- EDST 2480 (or equivalent)
- Students must meet UW admissions requirements and all admissions requirements for the Wyoming Teacher Education Program.
- Students may be admitted if they are missing some content requirements, but the following courses must be completed according to the prerequisites:
- Prior to EDST 3000:
 - EDEX 2484
- Prior to EDEC 4320 (Oral and Written Lang. Acq.): EDEL 2280
- Prior to EDEL 4409 (Math/Science methods): MATH 1000*, 1100, and 1105
- EDEL 1410, 1420, 1430, 1440, and 1450
- BIOL 1020, CHEM/PHYS 1090, GEOL/ASTR 1070
- HLED 2006
- Prior to EDEL 4309 (Humanities methods): GEOG 1000*
- * Verify this requirement with program coordinator
- Students must meet the same Wyoming Teacher Education Program admission criteria as for campus-based programs:
- 2.75 (minimum) cumulative GPA
- 2.50 (minimum) GPA in these courses: the six required EDEL courses, the three required MATH courses, the three required science courses, and HLED 2006.

The tuition and fee rates are the standard UW Outreach rates, which are indexed to resident tuition. The UW Board of Trustees approved a distance delivery fee for this program: \$400 per semester (fall & spring semesters only). All other fees relevant to the Wyoming Teacher Education Program are the same as those for on-campus students.

FINANCIAL AID

• Hathaway Scholarship funds can be used for this program by qualifying students.

OTHER PROGRAM INFORMATION

• This program will only be delivered in Wyoming. The video conferencing system used for course delivery does not extend beyond state borders.

• This program is intended to serve individuals seeking their first bachelor's degree. It is not a post-baccalaureate certification program. If you have a BA and are interested in seeking a second bachelor's degree, please contact the program coordinator/advisor on the reverse side for details.

• At the community college, students must complete courses necessary to meet the American diversity, speech/ acting, art and music requirements. The program coordinator and the community college contacts will help students identify appropriate course selections or identify transfer credit options.

• The program coordinator will assist students with advising to assure the completion of 48 credit hours of upper division coursework to meet university requirements.

• FCSC 4130 is the internship requirement to complete the full endorsement in Early Childhood Education; it is not required for the ELEM degree.

• Students must continue to meet all prerequisite requirements for the Wyoming Teacher Education Program during successive phases to assure continuation in the statewide delivery option. For details see the WTEP Handbook at

• Field experiences will be required in EDST 3000 EDEL 4309 and EDEL 4500 (16 week Residency). The program coordinator will work with cohort members and Outreach coordinators to identify appropriate field experience settings as close to their city of residence as possible.
