I. Call to Order

- Roll call conducted.
- Approval of Agenda:

Motion to suspend the rules (to consider an item not introduced a week in advance) was moved by Senator Barks and seconded by Senator Roberts.

- Motion approved with no opposition.
- o Agenda amended to include **Item 8** (new program introduction from SER/CEPS).
- o Vote to approve amended agenda: Passed unanimously.
- Approval of Minutes (October 20, 2025):

Motion to approve by Senator Cawley, seconded by Senator Jarmen.

- Discussion: Senator Martin (re: Human Trafficking SAP) clarified that *Good Samaritan* language will be removed and addressed separately.
- o Minutes approved as corrected.

II. Reports

Chair's Report – Rob Godby

- Presidential Search:
 - o Officially announced today via press release.

o Timeline:

- December: Committee meets for status update.
- January: Review of applications.
- February: Two meetings for initial cuts and first-round virtual interviews.
- March: On-campus finalist visits;
- Trustees conduct interviews late March—early April.
- o Trustees will make the final selection. President Seidel steps down June 30, 2026.
- Members encouraged to forward qualified candidates to Parker Executive Search or the UW Presidential Search webpage.

• Shared Governance Committee:

- Draft report nearing completion; to be presented to Trustees Nov. 19–21 before Thanksgiving.
- Faculty Senate will receive the draft at the Nov. 17 meeting.
- The report identifies next steps to realign governance processes rather than prescriptive actions.

• Academic Integrity, AI, and Student Probation Discussion:

- o Meeting held with **Michelle Hillaire** regarding AI-related academic dishonesty and probation processes.
- Discussion centered on creating campus-wide faculty resources addressing AI in pedagogy and assessment.
- o Key comments:
 - Sen. Anderson: AI is inaccurate in fields like medieval history.
 - *Chair Godby:* Faculty must engage in ongoing discussion; adaptation will vary by discipline.
 - *Provost Turpen:* A committee is addressing faculty use of AI.
 - *Sen. McCoy:* Concerned about pace of technological change and reliance on volunteer committees.
 - Sen. Bialostok: Parallels drawn to calculator introduction; AI may prompt reassessment of assignments.
 - Consensus: AI literacy and ethical use must become part of UW's educational goals.

• Retiree Microsoft Access:

 Some retirees lost access to Microsoft tools. The administration and Amy Mclaughlin (VPIT) are aware and working toward resolution. Senate encouraged to share affected names.

• ASUW Report – ASUW Senator Dillon:

- o ASUW passed SER accreditation certificate.
- o DIA shuttle service launch pending.
- o Hathaway Scholarship expansion resolution enters first reading this week.

Staff Senate:

No representative present.

General Announcements:

- Faculty Conciliator and Dispute Resolution Panel nominations open per University Regulation 2-2.
- o Three conciliators are needed; position pays \$3,000 per semester. Currently one nominee.

III. Discussion: Joint Faculty/Staff Senate Themes and Next Steps

Four themes identified:

- 1. Community and Belonging fostering engagement and inclusion.
- 2. Work Environment and Well-being morale, job satisfaction, mental health.
- 3. **Institutional Impact** improving student outcomes, process efficiency, website usability, parking, etc.
- 4. **Communication and Collaboration** improving transparency, combating misperceptions, and aligning shared mission.

Additional proposed theme: Institutional transparency and shared governance. Concerns were raised about Title IX processes, retaliation, uneven enforcement, and a perception that UW adheres to the *letter* rather than the *spirit* of the law.

Next Steps:

- Shared Governance Committee to present report to Faculty Senate, Staff Senate, and Cabinet this week.
- Campus-wide survey for input forthcoming.
- Emphasis placed on **inclusivity over speed** in implementation.

Senate Discussion Highlights:

- Sen. Tabler: Multiple committees addressing similar issues—need consolidation to reduce fatigue.
- Sen. Perkins: Committees should analyze data to streamline communication and engagement.
- Sen. Okopodu: Suggests using "Poll Everywhere" for brief anonymous surveys.
- *Sen. McElroy:* Urged faculty to remain focused on the University's mission and shared purpose.
- *Chair Godby:* Mission statement has shifted over time; Senate should reexamine its evolution and implications.

IV. Resolution 496: UW Regulation 6-4 – Demonstrations on University Grounds

• Postponed pending clarification from the **Office of General Counsel (OGC).**

V. Resolution 497: Anti-Human Trafficking and Forced Labor SAP (Updated)

- Presented by Council Member Martin.
- Revision incorporates federal compliance requirements and removes *Good Samaritan* language (will appear in a separate SAP).
- **Motion:** Senator Fertig moved to delete last sentence of Section E (Part 3), seconded by Senator Robison.
- Motion passed.
- Resolution **passed as amended (1 opposed)** and will include clarifying language regarding transportation obligations before transmittal.

VI. Resolution 498: Student Death Notification Protocol

- Clarifies notification procedures to the campus community.
- Amendment: Section 3 (bottom of page 1) revised to specify "generally within 48 hours."
- Motion to amend by Sen. Cawley, seconded by Sen. Fertig.
- Amendment and final resolution passed unanimously.

VII. Resolution 499: Unmanned Aerial Systems (Drone) Policy

Postponed pending clarification from OGC.

VIII. Resolution 500: SER/CEPS Subsurface Energy Certificate Program Proposal

- Introduction only; full consideration at next meeting.
- Short introduction of purpose and need by Kami Danaei (SER) and Minou Rabiei (PETE)
- Designed for non-engineering majors (Energy Resources and SER collaboration).
- Addresses workforce needs despite national enrollment decline in energy programs.

IX. New Business / Other Items

• StartRight Textbook Program:

- o Concerns raised regarding lack of transparency and student opt-out difficulties.
- Faculty reported confusion over eBook licenses (180-day limits) and late notifications.
- Bookstore Director Misty will be invited to address the Senate.

• Staff Representation on Presidential Search Committee:

- o Senators expressed disappointment that staff are not included as voting members.
- o Chair Godby noted that the Board of Trustees determines membership; Faculty and Staff Senates are consulted but not guaranteed representation.
- o Senators emphasized the need for inclusive participation in future searches.

• Drone Policy:

o College of Agriculture submitted a formal response. Members should send additional feedback to Chair Godby and OGC.
