



## 2025 University of Wyoming Housing Community Options

We invite you to join a Living Learning Community (LLC). LLCs are residence hall communities focused around students' academic goals, interests, or hobbies. Some LLCs also offer the opportunity to take one to four Fall courses with your peers in the LLC.

LLCs are a friendly and fun way to begin life at UW. Instead of making your way through those first research papers, final exams, and study sessions alone, you'll be part of a community of learners, yet you'll maintain the flexibility to be independent too.

A First-Year Interest Group (FIG) is a faculty-sponsored LLC that includes a required set of courses. Faculty sponsors lead and attend some floor events and join some meals with the community. Required courses within these communities are meant to help students fulfill necessary courses within the major or college.

Other LLCs have recommended courses -- in these, you can live on the floor of your choice with or without taking a common class. ### **Please note:**

- Choosing a LLC **is not required** and placement is based on availability and **not guaranteed**.
- If you are **not interested** in applying for a LLC, please **select 'NO PREFERENCE'** and click "save and continue."
- Applying for a LLC indicates your **consent to being enrolled in any required courses** associated with that LLC.
- If you apply for a LLC and are accepted (you will be notified of this decision via UW email), **you will be required to live on the community floor or pod**.
- Generally, **roommate requests can still be honored** if your requested roommate is in the same LLC or has listed 'NO PREFERENCE' as their option.

Next you will see descriptions of 36 options for major and interest-based LLCs. Please read through this list carefully making note of those you are most interested in joining. In the next step, you will be asked to rank your top three LLC choices or NO PREFERENCE if you prefer not to participate in a Living Learning Community.

<b>20+/Sophomore+/Transfer/Graduate Students</b>	White Hall	1 optional course	Not a first-year student? You may feel more at home in this community.
<b>Adventures in STEM</b>	McIntyre/South Hall	1 optional course	This LLC focuses on innovative STEM research, STEM issues impacting Wyoming, and opportunities for students to learn about STEM majors and co-curricular opportunities.
<b>Air Force ROTC</b>	White Hall	1 required course	A community for students in the Air Force ROTC.
<b>Animal Science</b>	McIntyre/South Hall	2 required courses	Explore Animal Science with an equestrian as your community sponsor who will attend events and meals with you.
<b>Army ROTC</b>	White Hall	2 required courses	A community for students in the Army ROTC.
<b>Brown &amp; Gold: School Spirit</b>	North Hall	1 optional course	Are you part of UW Athletics or maybe just a super fan? This LLC is a good fit for you!
<b>Business Foundations</b>	North Hall	3 required courses	This community includes coursework required of majors in the College of Business and a faculty sponsor who attends events and meals with residents.
<b>College of Agriculture, Life Sciences, and Natural Resources</b>	McIntyre/South Hall	No courses	Members of this community are students in the College of Agriculture, Life Sciences, and Natural Resources.
<b>College of Engineering and Physical Sciences</b>	McIntyre/South Hall	No courses	This community is for majors and minors in the College of Engineering and Physical Sciences.
<b>College of Health Sciences</b>	North Hall	No courses	Students in the College of Health Sciences can build lasting friendships in this community.
<b>Construction Management</b>	McIntyre/South Hall	3 required courses	Get to know professors in the field of construction management and share classes, events, and meals with other CM majors.
<b>Criminal Justice</b>	North Hall	3 required courses	Sponsored by faculty in the department who attend events and meals with students majoring or minoring in criminal justice.
<b>Energy &amp; Environment</b>	McIntyre/South Hall	2 required courses	For future energy leaders, the community sponsored by the School of Energy Resources (SER) helps students discover how our economy and public policy intertwine with energy management.
<b>Exploring Health Careers</b>	North Hall	3 required courses	This community includes coursework required by all health science majors, so students must have a 23+ math ACT score (560+ SAT) or a Level 3 on the Math Placement Exam. You can enjoy the benefit of securing a seat in high demand courses while getting to know faculty and staff in the College of Health Science.

<b>Exploring Teaching Careers</b>	White Hall	2 required courses	This community is for anyone who wants to learn more about careers in teaching. Sponsored by a professor in the College of Education, residents in this community share classes, events, and meals together.
<b>Female Only</b>	McIntyre/South Hall	No courses	This community is for those who prefer a floor composed of only female residents.
<b>First Generation LLC</b>	White Hall	1 optional course	The First-Generation community is offered to students whose parents/legal guardians have not completed a 4-year degree (bachelor's degree).
<b>Focus on Pharmacy</b>	North Hall	2 required courses	This community includes coursework required by all health science majors, so students must have a 23+ math ACT score (560+ SAT) or a Level 3 on the Math Placement Exam. You can enjoy the benefit of securing a seat in high demand courses while getting to know faculty and staff in the Pharmacy.
<b>Foodies Community</b>	White Hall	1 optional course	Love to cook, bake, or just eat? This community is for you!
<b>Foundations in Art &amp; Art History</b>	White Hall	3 required courses	Students in visual arts will get a better understanding of the major and minor in art and art history from the close relationship established with faculty sponsors from the art department.
<b>Haub School of Environment &amp; Natural Resources</b>	North Hall	No courses	Open to any major, the Environment & Outdoors community helps you think across boundaries to better understand our interconnected world and pressing environmental and natural resource challenges.
<b>International Studies</b>	North Hall	2 required courses	This community is for majors and minors in international studies. A dedicated faculty sponsor from the department will attend events and meals with residents.
<b>Kinesiology &amp; Health</b>	North Hall	3 required courses	This community includes coursework required by all health science majors, so students must have a 23+ math ACT score (560+ SAT) or a Level 3 on the Math Placement Exam. You can enjoy the benefit of securing a seat in high demand courses while getting to know faculty and staff in the Kinesiology & Health.
<b>Male Only</b>	McIntyre/South Hall	No courses	This community is for those who prefer a floor composed of only male residents.
<b>Marching Band</b>	McIntyre/South Hall	1 required course	Build a community with others interested in music and who are members of the highly acclaimed Western Thunder Marching Band!
<b>Outdoor Recreation</b>	North Hall	2 required courses	This floor is sponsored by the Outdoor Program and will explore concepts of leadership and personal growth through outdoor adventure.
<b>Pre-Law</b>	North Hall	No courses	Sponsored by the pre-law advisor, this class exposes pre-law students to expectations of law school.

<b>Pre-Nursing</b>	North Hall	1 optional course	Pre-Nursing students will benefit from the close connections to others in that field and a sponsor who shares meals and events with residents.
<b>Psychology</b>	White Hall	1 optional course	This community is for majors and minors in psychology who will benefit from the mentorship of a professor in psychology who will attend meals and events.
<b>Stories that Make Us</b>	White Hall	No courses	This LLC examines the stories that make us and the stories that matter to others. The floor activities, sponsor, and community building will focus on this theme.
<b>Travel the World: Exploring Study Abroad</b>	North Hall	1 required course	Interested in learning more about study abroad and traveling? This LLC works with a sponsor from the Education Abroad program on campus.
<b>Undeclared and Exploring Majors</b>	White Hall	1 optional course	The Finding Your Passion: Exploring Majors and Careers community is for students who want to explore career paths and make connections with advisors who assist with self-assessment and self-reflection throughout the academic year.
<b>Veterinary Science &amp; One Health</b>	McIntyre/South Hall	2 required courses	This community includes coursework required by all veterinary science majors, so students must have a 23+ math ACT score (560+ SAT) or a Level 3 on the Math Placement Exam. Enjoy the benefit of getting to know a faculty member in the field of veterinary medicine who attends meals and events.
<b>Videogaming &amp; Esports</b>	White Hall	No courses	Learn more about the UWYO Esports club in this welcoming gaming community open to all folks, from the weekend warrior to the daily grinder.
<b>Western Heritage: Ranching and Leadership</b>	McIntyre/South Hall	2 required courses	Learn about courses and careers in the Ranch Management and Agriculture Leadership program at UW.
<b>Wyoming Rocks: Boots on the Ground Geology</b>	McIntyre/South Hall	2 required courses	Open to all majors, this interactive outdoor enthusiast community will experience geological fieldwork around Wyoming and get to know award-winning faculty in the geology department who will host residents to a meal and attend floor events.
<b>NO PREFERENCE</b>	Any available	No courses	LLC placements are prioritized over NO PREFERENCE placements. If you have a confirmed roommate in an LLC, every effort will be made to place you with them. Otherwise, your placement is random.
