<b>Programme:</b>	<b>Global Environment Facility (GEF)</b>
<b>Objective:</b>	The Global Environment Facility (GEF) Small Grants Programme (SGP) implemented by the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) provides civil society and community-based organizations (CSOs/CBOs) in developing countries with grants to enable them to tackle global environmental challenges <sup>1</sup> while addressing local sustainable development needs. SGP Malaysia started financing projects in 2000. Since then, it has succeeded in funding and providing technical support for more than 280 grant projects.
<b>Eligible Activities:</b>	This call for proposals aims to solicit civil society organizations to put forward proposals that help SGP undertake a preparatory process to develop its strategy for OP8. This will involve multi-stakeholder consultations, development of baseline assessment(s) of priority identified landscape(s)/seascape(s), and elaboration of the Malaysia Country Programme Strategy (CPS) for OP8 in close coordination with the SGP

<b>Call Title:</b>	<b>CALL FOR PROPOSALS IN UKRAINE TO SUPPORT VULNERABLE COMMUNITIES</b>
<b>Programme: Italian Agency for Development Cooperation (AICS)</b>	
<b>Objective:</b>	The Italian Government, through the Italian Agency for Development Cooperation (AICS) in Kyiv, has launched a new €21 million call for proposals to provide emergency humanitarian aid to the most affected Ukrainian communities. The initiative will be implemented by civil society organizations (CSOs) active in the country.
<b>Eligible Activities:</b>	This is the third AICS call for proposals for CSOs since the beginning of the war, reinforcing an intervention model that prioritizes direct engagement with civil society and local authorities. Previous initiatives funded 39 projects totaling €57 million, providing essential humanitarian aid and services to over one million people. The new initiative promotes localized aid, focusing on communities most affected by the war, particularly those near the front line.

<b>Programme:</b>	<b>Agence Française de Développement (AFD)</b>
<b>Objective:</b>	The AFD is launching a call for proposals to support the resilience of areas and populations affected by forced displacements due to the conflict in Sudan, by ensuring that women and girls, particularly affected by the consequences of the conflict, are central drivers to foster resilience and prevent conflicts. With a total amount of 8 M EUR, it aims to finance a development project implemented by international nongovernmental organizations and national or civil society organizations.
<b>Eligible Activities:</b>	<p>This call for proposals is part of the #AvecElles initiative (“With Women”), aimed at protecting and empowering refugee women, jointly launched by France and UNHCR on the occasion of the 2023 Global Refugee Forum. It also contributes to France’s Action Plan on “Women, Peace and Security” (2021-2025).</p> <p>Activities must be carried out in Sudan, South Sudan and Ethiopia. The proposal should target at least two of these countries.</p>

<b>Programme:</b>	<b>Standards and Trade Development Facility (STDF)</b>
<b>Objective:</b>	Funds are available for PPGs to prepare technically sound and sustainable projects. These grants can involve the application of SPS-related capacity evaluation tools, preparation of feasibility studies and/or formulation of project proposals to address specific SPS capacity building needs linked to trade.
<b>Eligible Activities:</b>	<p>PPGs are intended to help overcome constraints faced by developing countries in the articulation of their SPS needs into complete project proposals that could be funded by the STDF or other donors. PPGs can be used for any of the following purposes (or a combination thereof):</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Application of SPS-related capacity evaluation and prioritization tools .</li> <li>• Preparation of feasibility studies that precede project development to assess the potential impact and economic viability of proposals in terms of their expected costs and benefits; and/or</li> <li>• Preparation of project proposals that can be funded by the STDF or other donors.</li> <li>• PPGs may also be awarded to assist eligible beneficiaries to revise project proposals which the STDF Working Group deems of interest but in need of revision before final approval can be granted.</li> </ul> <p>Actions can take place in various countries from the OECD DAC list.</p>
