Natural persons (individual citizens) or institutions of state administration directly subordinated to the state and its bodies, e.g., ministries, government and state agencies, embassies, etc. can neither apply nor be valid project partners.

Private entrepreneurs are not eligible to apply or be partners.

Subjects that possess full or partial independence from state administration and possess self-governance (such as universities, academic, artistic, social, educational, cultural, research and/or science organizations, municipalities, and local governments, etc.) can apply for the Fund's support.

If the applicant is a research or higher education institution with several organizational units (e.g., universities, academies of science, etc.), they are obliged to indicate the name of the smallest possible organizational unit (institute, department, etc.) entrusted with the project's implementation. Without this information, the application will not be considered eligible. When choosing the appropriate unit, make sure that they are entitled, according to their internal rules, to independently apply for project funding.

Should an overlapping larger unit (e.g. a faculty of the university) have a running grant in the same grant scheme that the applicant wishes to apply for, it is the responsibility of the applicant to make sure that the running project is administered by a separate subunit (e.g. the applicant is a department under a faculty which already has a running project – a clear separation of subunits will be necessary to make the new proposal eligible).

| | Purpose Youth Ambassadors programs offer youth (typically between the ages of 15-18) and adult mentors the opportunity to examine civic engagement and leadership development through short-term exchanges in the United States. YA-AF should offer participants from countries in sub Saharan Africa the opportunity to engage in a variety |





of activities such as, but not limited to, workshops on civic education, community site visits related to the program themes, and homestays with American families. Upon return home, participants should apply what they have learned to implement projects that serve their communities. Multiple opportunities for participants to interact meaningfully with their U.S. peers must be included.

Eligible Activities:

Objectives

The objectives of the program are for participants to:

Demonstrate a better understanding of the elements of participatory democracy in action:

Deepen critical thinking, problem-solving, and empathetic leadership skills; and Develop program planning and implementation skills to strengthen local communities. Goals

The program goals are to:

Prepare youth leaders to become responsible citizens and contributing members of their communities;

Empower participants to be actively engaged in addressing issues of concern in their communities upon their return home;

Build mutual understanding, tolerance, and respect between U.S. citizens and the citizens of other countries;

Foster relationships among youth from across sub-Saharan Africa and their U.S. counterparts.

Themes

The primary program themes are:

Civic Engagement (such as citizen participation, community service, participatory democracy, rule of law, volunteerism, etc.); and

Leadership Development (such as ethical leadership, team building, public speaking, negotiation, goal setting, and project planning).

Eligible Applicants:

Eligibility Criteria

The following organizations are eligible to apply:

U.S. not-for-profit organizations, including think tanks and civil society/non-governmental organizations

U.S. public and private educational institutions

Other Eligibility Requirements.

All organizations must have a Unique Entity Identifier (UEI) issued via SAM.gov as well as a valid registration in SAM.gov.

ECA's Grant Guidelines require that organizations demonstrate at least four years of experience in conducting international exchanges to be eligible for awards exceeding \$130,000 in ECA funding. issuing one award, for approximately \$1,000,000, pending availability of funds. Therefore, organizations must demonstrate four years of experience in conducting international exchanges in your proposal to be eligible to apply under this competition.

All proposals must comply with the requirements stated in the NOFO, Project Objectives, Goals, and Instructions (POGI) document, and the PSI; not doing so may result in your proposal being declared technically ineligible and given no further consideration in the review process.

All proposals must contain a SF-424, executive summary, proposal narrative, budget (SF 424A), detailed line-item budget, and budget narrative.

Only one proposal will be considered by ECA from each applicant organization. In cases where more than one submission from an applicant appears in grants.gov, ECA





will only consider the submission made closest in time to the NOFO deadline; that submission would constitute the one and only proposal ECA would review from that applicant.

Participating countries may include: Angola, Benin, Botswana, Burkina Faso, Burundi, Cabo Verde, Cameroon, Central African Republic (CAR), Chad, Comoros, Cote d'Ivoire, Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC), Djibouti, Eswatini, Ethiopia, Gabon, The Gambia, Ghana, Guinea, Kenya, Lesotho, Liberia, Madagascar, Malawi, Mali, Mauritania, Mauritius, Mozambique, Namibia, Niger, Nigeria, Republic of Congo, Rwanda, Sao Tome and Principe, Senegal, Seychelles, Sierra Leone, South Africa, South Sudan, Sudan, Tanzania, Togo, Uganda, Zambia, and Zimbabwe.

| Objective: | The European Commission is accepting proposals for its Alleviating household energy poverty in Europe. Objectives The European Green Deal sets out to ensure an energy transition that is socially just and inclusive. In accordance with the Fit for 55 package, and in particular the recast Energy Efficiency Directive (EED), Member States shall take appropriate measures to empower and protect energy poor people and implement energy efficiency improvement measures as a priority among people affected by energy poverty, vulnerable customers, people in low-income households and, where applicable, people living in social housing. In addition, the EED (recast) underlines the need to address the split incentive dilemma and remove barriers to energy efficiency measures in multiowner properties. To ensure more coordinated action on energy poverty, an EC Recommendation on Energy Poverty and accompanying Staff Working Document further set out a series of measures and policies that can be adopted. In this context, increasing the uptake of building renovation measures, including cooling solutions, can bring significant long-term benefits to energy poor households, and lead to lower energy bills and improved living conditions. Efforts should focus on offering support to overcome barriers to the uptake of renovation measures in residential multi-apartment buildings requiring coordinated action amongst homeowners and tenants, as well as supporting relevant actors, including public authorities, in designing longer-term strategies and coordination frameworks to mitigate energy poverty at different governance levels, including dedicated financing schemes specifically addressing energy performance improvements for energy poor households. |
| Eligible Activities: | Scopes Policy and coordination support to public authorities and stakeholders Support for residential multi-apartment building renovation Topics The indicators for this topic include: Number of energy poor households with reduced energy costs. Number of residential multi-apartment buildings renovated. Number of governance and decision-making structures adapted for residential multi-apartment buildings to facilitate energy renovation investments. Number of agreements concluded between homeowners and tenant associations demonstrating commitment to energy renovation investments. Number of energy poverty observatories and coordination structures established. Quantified multiple benefits, where relevant, for energy poor households, such as improved physical and mental health, comfort and indoor environment, better indoor |

air quality, improved social inclusion, reduced public health expenditure.





Number of energy poor consumers benefitting from the activities.

Number of legislative or implementing acts, policies or strategies created/adapted on energy poverty.

Other environmental impacts such as reduction of the production of harmful substances.

Expected Impacts

Proposals should present the concrete results which will be delivered by the activities and demonstrate how these results will contribute to the topic-specific impacts. This demonstration should include a detailed analysis of the starting point and a set of well-substantiated assumptions, and establish clear causality links between the results and the expected impact.

Proposals submitted under this topic should demonstrate how they will contribute to the reduction of energy poverty for the targeted households and the effective implementation of the regulatory framework and development of successful coordination structures, which can be replicated in other regions or Member States. Prebound/rebound effects should be taken into account and reported on, where relevant.

Depending on the scope and as relevant, proposals should demonstrate how they will contribute to:

Improved collaboration and knowledge exchange between different levels of public authorities and of social intermediaries involved in the coordination structures. Increased understanding and expertise in the public authorities in charge of implementing relevant EED (recast) provisions.

More effective and coherent implementation of provisions, including better planning, design and evaluation of energy poverty related policy measures.

Eligible Applicants:

Eligibility Criteria

In order to be eligible, the applicants (beneficiaries and affiliated entities) must: be legal entities (public or private bodies)

be established in one of the eligible countries, i.e.:

EU Member States (including overseas countries and territories (OCTs))

non-EU countries: listed EEA countries and countries associated to the LIFE Programme the coordinator must be established in an eligible country.

Ineligibility Criteria

Applicants which are subject to an EU exclusion decision or in one of the following exclusion situations that bar them from receiving EU funding can NOT participate: bankruptcy, winding up, affairs administered by the courts, arrangement with creditors, suspended business activities or other similar procedures (including procedures for persons with unlimited liability for the applicant's debts) in breach of social security or tax obligations (including if done by persons with unlimited liability for the applicant's debts)

guilty of grave professional misconduct (including if done by persons having powers of representation, decision-making or control, beneficial owners or persons who are essential for the award/implementation of the grant)

committed fraud, corruption, links to a criminal organisation, money laundering, terrorism-related crimes (including terrorism financing), child labour or human trafficking (including if done by persons having powers of representation, decision-making or control, beneficial owners or persons who are essential for the award/implementation of the grant)

shown significant deficiencies in complying with main obligations under an EU procurement contract, grant agreement, prize, expert contract, or similar (including if





done by persons having powers of representation, decision-making or control, beneficial owners or persons who are essential for the award/implementation of the grant)

guilty of irregularities within the meaning of Article 1(2) of Regulation No 2988/95 (including if done by persons having powers of representation, decision-making or control, beneficial owners or persons who are essential for the award/implementation of the grant)

created under a different jurisdiction with the intent to circumvent fiscal, social or other legal obligations in the country of origin or created another entity with this purpose (including if done by persons having powers of representation, decision-making or control, beneficial owners or persons who are essential for the award/implementation of the grant)

intentionally and without proper justification resisted an investigation, check or audit carried out by an EU authorising officer (or their representative or auditor), OLAF, the EPPO, or the European Court of Auditors.

Applicants will also be rejected if it turns out that:

during the award procedure they misrepresented information required as a condition for participating or failed to supply that information

they were previously involved in the preparation of the call and this entails a distortion of competition that cannot be remedied otherwise (conflict of interest).
