<b>Objective:</b>	<p>Objective</p> <p>This project will establish the European Invasive Alien Species Rapid-Response Fund, a three- year initiative which aims to prevent the establishment and therefore future impacts of biological invasions in the EU.</p>
<b>Eligible Activities:</b>	<p>The specific objectives are to:</p> <p>facilitate rapid and cost-effective responses to introductions of alien species that could severely and negatively impact biodiversity and the related ecosystem services, as well as human wellbeing in the EU.</p> <p>build capacity with actions to increase the capacity of stakeholders on rapid eradication.</p> <p>The project must directly address an early-stage invasion of an alien species (i.e. non-native, either breeding or non-breeding) that has a high risk of spread in the near future resulting in negative impacts to biodiversity and related ecosystem services (i.e. become an invasive alien species).</p>

Objective:	The ASEAN–Republic of Korea Cooperation Fund supports collaborative programmes and projects that enhance strategic partnership, promote regional integration, and address shared development priorities between ASEAN and the Republic of Korea.
Eligible Activities:	<p>The fund prioritises cooperation in public health, education and training, culture and tourism, economic cooperation and resilience, environment and climate-related initiatives, safety and peace, ASEAN Community building efforts, alignment with the ASEAN–ROK Comprehensive Strategic Partnership, consistency with the ASEAN Outlook on the Indo-Pacific, implementation of the ASEAN–ROK Plan of Action, and initiatives that promote sustainable, inclusive, and long-term regional impact. It supports projects that respond to regional needs, emerging challenges, and opportunities for deeper cooperation across multiple sectors.</p> <p>Project proposals may be submitted through the Annual Call for Project Proposals or through the Special Track mechanism, designed to address urgent or emerging regional issues. All proposals undergo a structured review process to assess strategic alignment, feasibility, sustainability, and budgetary soundness before approval. The fund also places importance on sustainability and visibility, encouraging projects to generate long-term benefits beyond the funding period and to clearly reflect ASEAN–ROK cooperation in their activities and outputs. Through this approach, the fund contributes to stronger institutional linkages, shared knowledge, and enduring partnerships between ASEAN and the Republic of Korea.</p>
Eligible Applicants:	The project support framework provides clear guidance on the formulation, submission, appraisal, approval, and implementation of funded initiatives. In line with the ASEAN Cooperation Project Design and Management Manual, the framework defines key roles in project development and implementation: the proponent refers to the initiator or formulator of a project proposal, comprising both the individual and the organisation they represent, while the Implementing Agency (IA) is the legal entity responsible for implementing an approved ASEAN cooperation project. Notably, the proponent can also serve as the Implementing Agency.
