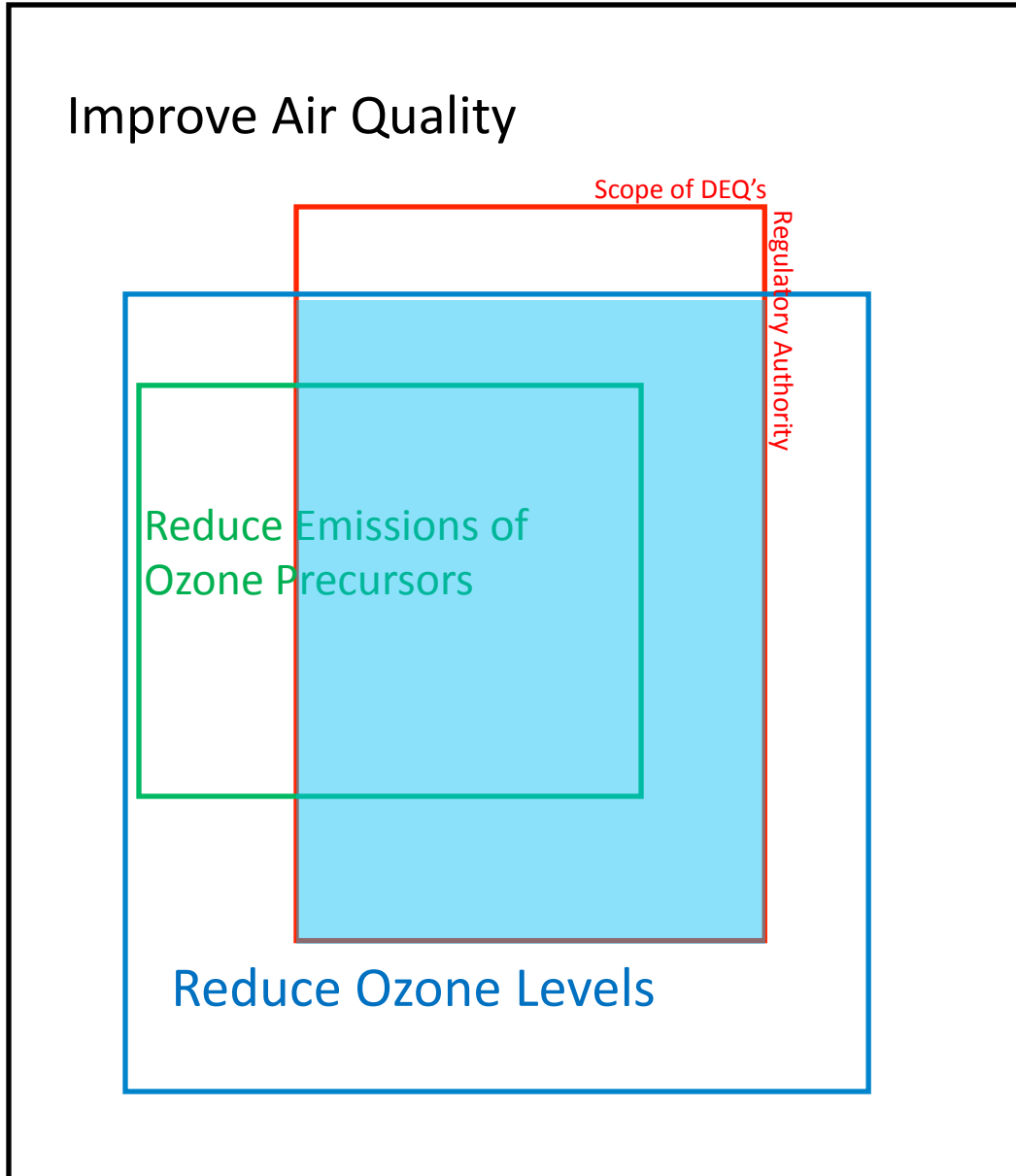
Task Force Process & Time Line

- Meeting 1: Procedural ground work
- Meeting 2: Finish procedural work; begin discussion on technical issues
- Meeting 3: Solidify technical reference; frame issues; specify interests; generate options
- Meeting 4: Continue to generate options; evaluate options; reach agreement on recommendations; evaluate progress

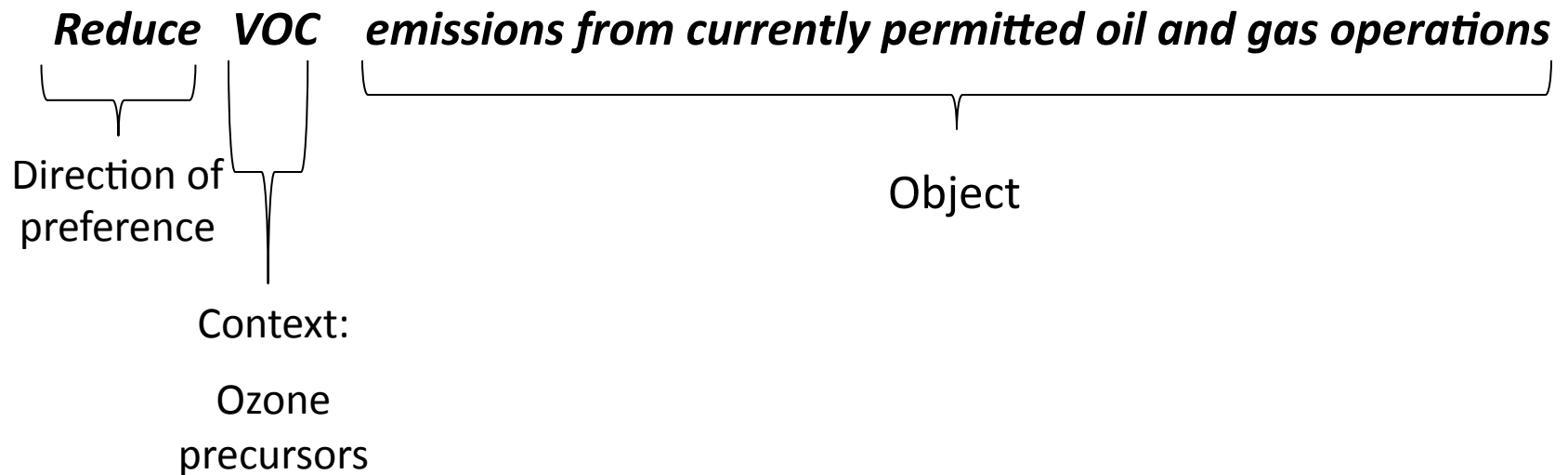
- Decision context (framing the issue)

Defining Your Decision Context

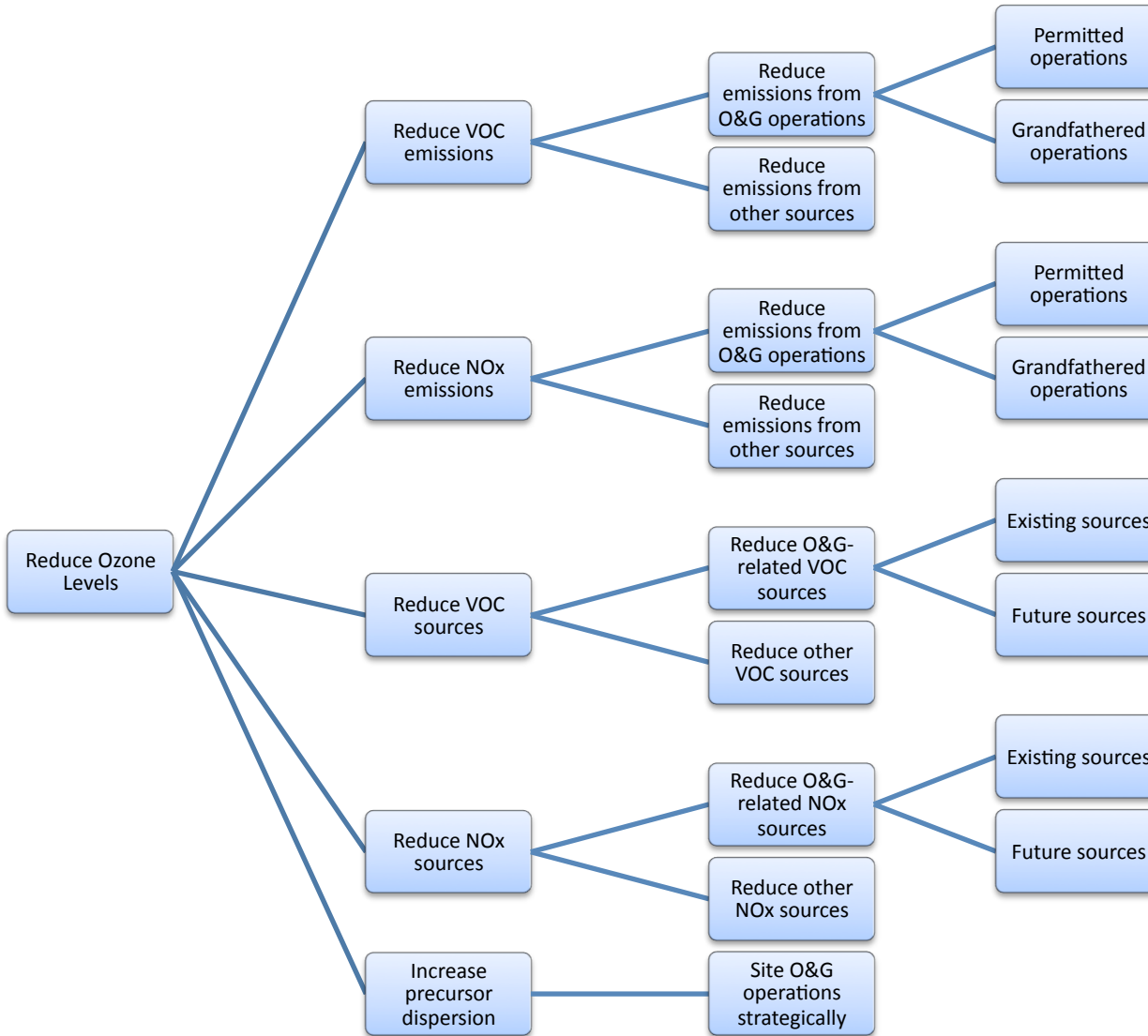


Objectives

- Characterized by three features:



Structuring Objectives



Interest Statements

- Interests are needs, constraints, principles and values
- They help you evaluate the recommendations of the task force
- Interests are belong to you, personally or professionally
- Substantive or procedural

Interest Statements

- Focus on interests that aren't explicitly tied to your objectives, but lie just beneath the surface
- Examples:
 - Expediency in reducing ozone levels
 - Predictability in DEQ's direction and enforcement
 - Maintaining a strong tax base

Putting It All Together

- Develop options (recommended actions) that:
 - Are specific to the decision context
 - Achieve one or more objectives
 - Satisfy your own interests and those of your fellow Task Force members
