



UGRB Air Quality Citizens Advisory Task Force Decision Context Diagrams May 9, 2012

The following diagrams are illustrations of the “decision context” that small groups of Task Force members created. The decision context defines the scope of the Task Force’s recommendations. The scope can be either very broad, such as to improve air quality, or quite narrow, such as to reduce emissions of ozone precursors.




Group #1 Decision Context:

1. Reduce emissions of ozone precursors
2. Recommendations should go beyond the scope of DEQ’s regulatory authority




Group #2 Decision Context:

1. Reduce ozone precursors generated by the oil and gas industry
2. Recommendations should go beyond the scope of DEQ's regulatory authority
3. Recommendations should include the authority of BLM to permit oil and gas leases
4. Recommendations should include the ability of the oil and gas industry to voluntarily reduce ozone precursors



Group #3 Decision Context:

1. Reduce emissions of ozone precursors
2. Recommendations should go beyond the scope of DEQ's regulatory authority



Group #4 Decision Context:

1. Improve air quality
2. Reduce ozone levels
3. Recommendations should go beyond the scope of DEQ's regulatory authority
4. Recommendations should ensure maintenance of regional economic stability
5. Recommendations should support the national goal of energy independence
