Meeting Summary

I. Welcome & Announcements

A. Co-chairs Lisa McGee and Jim Neiman welcomed the Task Force to Saratoga.

II. Review of Recommendations

A. Jessica Clement led a discussion reviewing the draft recommendations created during the last meeting.

III. Presentation

A. Buddy Green (BLM), David Whittekiend (FS), and Jacque Buchanan (FS) led a discussion about the BLM and Forest Service budget process.

IV. Administrative Processes

- A. Jessica Clement led a group discussion on the issues identified by the task force to help frame a discussion about administrative processes. The group discussion focused on the administration of NEPA processes, permits, e.g. special use, recreational and grazing, timber contracts, and other budgetary and fiscal issues.
- B. The task force broke into three working groups. Each working group drafted their own recommendations and presented those recommendations to the group. The groups drafted recommendations regarding streamlining of regulation and increasing consistency in administrative procedures at the federal, forest and district levels.

V. Daryl Lutz Presentation

A. Daryl Lutz of the Wyoming Game and Fish Department gave a presentation to the Task Force about the Wyoming Mule Deer Initiative and resulting Platte Valley Habitat Partnership.



VI. Cooperation, collaboration and partnerships, local management, socio-economic and cultural factors

- A. Jessica Clement led a group discussion on cooperation, collaboration and partnerships, local management, socio-economic and cultural factors.
- B. The task force then broke into their three working groups again. Each working group drafted their own recommendations and presented those recommendations to the group. Recommendates were drafted that addressed proposals to enhance place-based collaborative capacity around forest management, and recommendations that can assist with removal of barriers to collaboration/cooperation.

VII. Diverse forest communities, wildlife habitat, inholdings, multiple use, ecosystem services, conservation and water

- A. Jessica Clement led a group discussion on the issues identified by the task force to frame the discussion on diverse forest communities, wildlife habitat, inholdings, multiple use, ecosystem services, conservation, and water. The task force discussed the challenge of understanding these processes, because of a lack of information or conflicting information about how the forest community changes over time.
- B. The task force then broke into their three working groups again. Each working group drafted their own recommendations and presented those recommendations to the group. Recommendates results that address the Wyoming Forest Action Plan, Roadless areas, OHV use, management tools, aspen management specifically, and ways to maintain and enhance resilience.

VIII. Tour of the Saratoga Wood Products Facility

A. Task Force members were able to tour the Saratoga Wood products facility. Saratoga Forest management offers high quality studs from the surrounding lodgepole pines.

IX. Disaster Funding

A. The Task Force engaged in a discussion about proposed legislation to change funding for wildfire disaster funding within the Forest Service. The Task Force decided to appoint a small group that will research the proposed legislation and report back to the Task Force at the next meeting. Those in the small group include Rep. Jerry Paxton, Bill Crapser, Richard Stem, Jim Neiman, and Sen. Ogden Driskell.

X. Housekeeping

- A. The Task Force engaged in a discussion about the locations of upcoming meetings. The Task Force decided to change the upcoming meeting location from Hulett to Casper. The Task Force chose to change the meeting location to Casper, because it is more centrally located and easier travel for the majority of the Task Force members. The final meeting will be also take place in Casper for the same reasons.
- B. The Task Force engaged in a discussion about whether they would like tours to be a part of the remaining meetings. While recognizing that tours are an invaluable experience the Task Force decided to not spend any future meeting time to take a tour. Rather, the Task Force felt the time could be better used discussing and drafting recommendations.



XI.		Richard Stem led a discussion with the Task Force about the history of Roadless and specifically the history of Roadless in Wyoming. The Task Force then engaged in a discussion about whether or not Roadless is a topic that the Task Force would like to tackle. The Task Force agreed that depending upon the purpose, context, and manner of the discussion they may consider having more detailed discussions about Roadless.

	A.	Steve Smutko led a discussion about data and monitoring. The Task Force discussed the lack of funding for monitoring. The Task Force also recognized that without knowing the current conditions to which to compare monitoring results, it is more difficult to offer prescriptions.

The three types of draft recommendations that resulted addressed measurable results, funding for monitoring and inventory needs.
