Sublette County along with federal and state land management agencies have always had a good working relationship on natural resource management and projects within the County. One example of that is the Piney Creeks Project, which was the result of the Fontenelle wildfire in 2012. This was a landscape scale cooperative restoration project involving both federal and state land management agencies, private land owners, Sublette County Weed and Pest, Sublette County Commissioners, Wyoming Game and Fish Department, and the Sublette County Conservation District. The group partnered with several groups to secure funding to aid with restoration projects and grazing deferral within the fire perimeter.

The formal formation of a collaborative will continue to improve upon cooperation within Sublette County, and hopefully build upon and add to the list of stakeholders that are involved with forest health and management in the County. With the one meeting that has occurred between interested parties the group has realized that not all stakeholders have been identified. The group realizes that additional stakeholders are needed as the collaborative continues to grow. Some of the issues in Sublette County in regards to forest health are wildland-urban interface, fuels management, and vegetation management in response to the mountain pine beetle. Specific projects have yet to be brought in front of the group by individual members at the time of this application to describe them in detail.

With the stakeholders already identified we have a good representation of all three themes and nopefully will build upon the representation as the collaborative grows. The group has alread dentified that recommendation 3 is a priority with many rural subdivisions that are in need of vegetation and fuels projects to help protect them from wildfire. These projects not only fall under recommendation 3, but also recommendations 5,6,9, and 12. We know as these projects come on line they will satisfy more than one recommendation in the report.	;

Wyoming State Forestry Division: State forest management - unknown at this time until project areas has been identified.

Bridger Teton National Forest: The Chief of the US Forest Service issued his Strategic Plan for FY 2015 - 2020, and it consists of four elements; Sustain, Deliver, Apply and Excel. The outcomes of each of these four elements specifically discuss building collaborative efforts to enhance resilient and adaptive environments and communities.

The Forest Service's Region 4 Business Plan for 2016 (which includes the Bridger-Teton NF) also includes Ecosystem Restoration and Sustainability, and Communities as two of its five emphasis items. These two emphasis items highlight seeking collaborative opportunities to address unprecedented land-management challenges and fostering and sustaining healthy landscapes near communities while augmenting stakeholder opportunities.

These two documents amplify and support the Bridger-Teton's efforts in seeking collaborative and engaged partners to address threats and issues that our local public Forest lands currently face. On the Bridger-Teton National Forest there are several themes that could potentially be addressed through a local collaborative effort and those themes include; Watershed conditions, Wildland fire potential, Wildlife habitats, and Community relationships.

High Desert District BLM: The entry of the Pinedale and Rock Springs Field offices into a collaborative forestry management program with Sublette County and other entities is consistent with the goals and management objectives of the Bureau of Land Management (BLM). Collaborative management will enhance treatment possibilities and promote or enhance the probability of successful forestry treatments on BLM lands.

Mapping/Surveying- Partners time associated with project planning, layout, and design 75 hours averaging \$30/hour = \$2,250.

Facilitation- Sublette County Commission is sponsoring a field trip to identified project sites for the group in the amount of \$1,000.


