Student Teaching Experience (12 credit hours)

Students must complete a 12 credit hour student teaching experience that includes eight weeks of full-time teaching at the elementary level and eight weeks of full-time teaching at the secondary level.

NOTE: Students must have current CPR certification prior to enrolling in KIN 4099.

Elected Coursework (6 credit hours)

Students must complete a minimum of six credit hours of elected coursework beyond the credit hours listed under elected coursework for FRESHMAN-SOPHOMORE YEARS. It is recommended that these courses are selected from those required for the Adapted Physical Education K-12 or Health Education K-12 teaching endorsement area.

Minimum Degree Requirements: 120 credit hours, 48 of which must be at the 3000-4000 level

PROFESSIONAL PROGRAM ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

You must make application for admission to the professional Physical Education Teacher Education (PHET) program once you meet the requirements to enter KIN 3012, Teaching Lab I (only offered fall semester).

Entry Criteria

- 1. Minimum 2.75 GPA; preferred GPA of 3.0
- Successful completion of: CHEM 1000/1020; ENGL 1010; ENGL 2020; FCSC 1140/1141; HLED 1006; KIN 2000; KIN 2001; KIN 2003; KIN 2004; KIN 2005; KIN 2040; KIN 2041; LIFE 1010; MATH 1400, 1405, or 1450; PHYS 1050 or 1110; PSYC 1000; STAT 2050 or 2070; USP 2015 FYS; USP 2015 V; and ZOO 3115.
- 3. Minimum of 60 Contact Hours Completed
- 4. Interview and Essay Completed
- 5. Complete a Criminal Background Check

Admission to the PHET program is a competitive process. Applicants meeting minimum requirements are not guaranteed admission to the last four semesters of the program. The application deadline for fall semester admission is April 15. Students who make application for admission by April 15 will have their packets reviewed first. Application packets received after the deadline will only be reviewed if space is still available. A maximum of 20 students are admitted into the program each fall semester.

B. Coaching Education Endorsement

This requirement can be completed in one of the following two ways:

- a. By completing a "Coaching in . . ." course offered through a Wyoming Community College or the Wyoming Coaches Association Summer Clinic; or
- b. By completing a coaching experience in a specific sport for one season or more; a letter written by your supervising coach (coach must have a state coaching endorsement) must accompany the State Application Form for Wyoming Coaching Endorsement. The letter should include the following information: name of coach, sport coached, dates coached, grade and gender of school team coached, role of coach, and success of coach.
