New 3L students preferred followed by returning 3L students and then 2L students. If the registration is oversubscribed, additional students will be placed on a waitlist.

^{iv} Requires 3L standing, offered for a letter grade only. Defender Aid clinic enrollment is limited, determined by the faculty member. If the registration is oversubscribed additional students will be placed on a waitlist. Completion of, or concurrent enrollment in, Professional Responsibility is required and Criminal Adjudication and Criminal Procedure are strongly recommended.

^v Requires 3L standing and there will be an application and interview process.

^{vi} Preference given to 3L's and then second-semester 2L's, offered for a letter grade only. Family clinic enrollment is limited to 5 students; 4 determined on a first-come, first-served basis by registration. Offered for 3-credit letter grade only unless reapproved for returning student clinic independent study credit (to continue work on ongoing case or project). If you have questions, including about the commitment of the clinic, please talk to Professor Playton before registering so that others can anticipate whether they can get in. Completion of, or concurrent enrollment in, Professional Responsibility is required. If the registration is oversubscribed, additional students will be placed on a waitlist and may be enrolled at the clinic director's discretion.

^{vii} Requires 3L standing, offered for a letter grade only. Prosecution Assistance clinic enrollment is limited to 8 students; 7 determined on a first-come, first-served basis by registration. If the registration is oversubscribed additional students will be placed on a waitlist. Completion of Criminal Adjudication and Criminal Procedure is required beginning in the 2023-2024 academic year.

^{viii} Offered for S/U credit ONLY. One credit per competition. Credit is given to student competitors in approved inter-school competitions. Please see our Registrar if you have any questions regarding which are approved competitions. Credit is applied in the semester after the student participates in the regional or national competition. The student must register for the credit and submit the form to receive credit. The required form can be downloaded from the website.

^{ix} Offered for a letter grade only. EPP enrollment is limited to seven (7) total students. Six (6) determined on a first come, first served basis by registration. The seventh will be the Student Director. If the registration is oversubscribed, additional students will be placed on a waitlist. With the following priority, (1) returning 3L students, (2) followed by 3L students, followed by 2L students who meet the prerequisites for the EPP. The Prerequisites for the EPPP are Trust & Estates prior to enrolling, plus either have taken or are currently enrolled in Professional Responsibility.

^x Offered for S/U credit ONLY. If you are interested in a fall externship, you must submit an application and resume to our Externship Director, Kipp Coddington, by the **First Friday in July**. Students may NOT take a legal clinic in the same semester in which they participate in an extern program, unless they obtain prior written permission from both the Externship Director and the Clinic Director.

^{xi} Independent Study is research and writing in specialized or advanced areas of the law. Students receive one credit hour for 50 hours of work or 2 credit hours for 100 hours of work. Grades are generally based on a research paper. Students must submit a completed Independent Study form to our Registrar within one week after the start of the semester. The student must register for the credit and submit the form to receive credit. The required form can be downloaded from the website.

^{xii} Clinic Independent Study is meant to allow students to receive credit for continuing work completed in conjunction with a clinic or live practicum. To qualify for Clinic Independent Study credit a student must have completed at least one semester in a clinic or live practicum, and must submit a form to the clinic or practicum instructor and our Registrar. The student must register for the credit and submit the form to receive credit. The required form can be downloaded from the website.

^{xiii} Offered for S/U credit ONLY. Requires Law Review membership.

^{xiv} Prerequisites for this course are Income Taxation and Agency & Partnership OR Business Organization.

^{xv} Trusts & Estates is a prerequisite for Estate Planning, Gift and Estate Tax, and the Estate Planning Practicum.

^{xvi} This course is a prerequisite for Advanced Water Law & Policy and the Advanced Water Law & Policy Field Seminar.
