<sup>1</sup> Civil Procedure II is a 2.0 credit course that will be offered on a compressed schedule in order to lessen the number of first year exams during the regularly scheduled exam period. Civil Procedure II will begin on Wednesday, January 18, 2023, and end on Wednesday, March 29, 2023. The final exam will be held on Friday, April 7, 2023, at 9:00 am.

<sup>2</sup> This course may not be offered in the 2023-2024 academic year.

<sup>3</sup> Professor will attend in person every few weeks, otherwise the class will be online.

<sup>4</sup> Requires 3L standing. Will meet for the last 9 weeks of the semester, starting on Feb. 21st. Course will be in person on Tuesdays and zoom on Thursdays.

<sup>5</sup> 3L students may register without approval. Offered for a letter grade only. Civil Legal Services clinic enrollment is limited to 8 students; 7 determined on a first-come, first-served basis by registration. If the registration is oversubscribed, additional students will be placed on a waitlist. 2L students entering their 4th semester may register upon email approval from Professor Hartzel. This course will meet on the first four Fridays of the semester; from 8-4 on the first 3 Fridays and 8-12 on the fourth Friday.

<sup>6</sup> Requires 3L standing, offered for a letter grade only. Defender Aid clinic enrollment is limited to 8 students, 7 determined on a first-come, first-served basis by registration. If the registration is oversubscribed additional students will be placed on a waitlist. Completion of, or concurrent enrollment in, Criminal Procedure and/or Criminal Adjudication strongly recommended. 2L students entering their 4th semester may register upon email approval from Professor McLane.

<sup>7</sup> 3L's have priority registration. Offered for a letter grade only. Family Law clinic enrollment is limited to 8 students; 7 determined on a first-come, first-served basis by registration. If the registration is oversubscribed, additional students will be placed on a waitlist. Priority will be given to students who have completed the Domestic Violence course or who will be taking it concurrently with the clinic. Recommended courses: Children & the Law, Domestic Violence and Family Law.

<sup>8</sup> Requires 3L standing, offered for a letter grade only. Prosecution Assistance clinic enrollment is limited to 8 students; 7 determined on a first-come, first-served basis by registration. If the registration is oversubscribed additional students will be placed on a waitlist. Completion of Criminal Adjudication and Criminal Procedure is required beginning in the 2023-2024 academic year.

<sup>9</sup> This course will meet via zoom for the first 8 weeks; the class will decide as a group whether to move to in-person meetings in March.

<sup>10</sup> Offered for S/U credit ONLY. One credit per competition. Credit is given to student competitors in approved inter-school competitions. Please see our Registrar, Dave Bluemel, if you have any questions regarding which are approved competitions. Credit is applied in the semester after the student participates in the regional or national competition. The student must register for the credit and submit the form to receive credit. The required form can be downloaded from the website.

<sup>11</sup> This is a study abroad course during January 2nd-13th. Contact Prof. Novogrodsky or Robison for additional details. Must be a 2L or 3L. If seats don't fill, 1L's may be allowed on a case by case basis and they may only take the course for S/U credit.

<sup>12</sup> If you've previously taken Business Organizations, then you cannot take Corporations.

<sup>13</sup> Offered for a letter grade only. Estate Planning practicum enrollment is limited to 8 students; 7 determined on a first-come, first-served basis by registration. If the registration is oversubscribed, additional students will be placed on a waitlist. Completion of Trusts & Estates prior to enrolling, plus either have taken or are currently enrolled in Professional Responsibility. New 3L students preferred,

followed by new 2L students that meet class requirements, followed by returning 3L students.

<sup>14</sup> Offered for S/U credit only. A description of the legal externships available in the spring semester and an application is included on the law school website. If you are interested in an externship, you must submit an application and resume to Tim Crawford at tcrawfo4@uwyo.edu by **November 4th**. 3L students may NOT take a legal clinic in the same semester in which they participate in an extern program unless they obtain prior written permission from both the Externship Director and the Clinic Director.

<sup>15</sup> This course is a prerequisite for Estate Planning. There will be 1 makeup class scheduled on a Friday of Professor Delaney's choosing. Income Taxations, Trusts and Estates are prerequisites for this course.

<sup>16</sup> Independent Study is the research and writing in specialized or advanced areas of the law. Students receive one credit hour for 50 hours of work or 2 credit hours for 100 hours of work. Grades are generally based on a research paper. Students must submit a completed Independent Study form to our Registrar, Dave Bluemel, within one week after the start of the semester. The student must register for the credit and submit the form to receive credit. The required form can be downloaded from the website.

<sup>17</sup> Independent Study: Clinic is meant to allow students to receive credit for continuing work completed in conjunction with a clinic or live practicum. To qualify for Clinic Independent Study credit a student must have completed at least one semester in a clinic or live practicum and must submit a form to the clinic or practicum instructor and our Registrar, Dave Bluemel. The student must register for the credit and submit the form to receive credit. The required form can be downloaded from the website.

<sup>18</sup> Offered for S/U credit ONLY. Requires Law Review Board membership.

<sup>19</sup> Students have the option to write a final paper or take a final exam.

<sup>20</sup> Trial Practice enrollment is limited to 16 students determined by a lottery, preference is given to third year students that have not taken Summer Institute Trial and then students who are going to be clinic directors. Please email Dave Bluemel to sign-up, with a sign-up deadline of November 10<sup>th</sup> at 5:00 p.m.
