10.14.1. Emperor Constantine to Orian, Count of the Crown Domain.

We order that if a person to whom we have made a gift, jointly with another, should perchance die without leaving an heir, his part of the gift shall belong to his associate in the gift, rather than to another person.

Note.

This law related to escheats.<sup>1</sup> If a joint done of property given by the emperor died without heirs, it did not escheat to the fisc, but went to the surviving done. See also C. 6.62.1 and note. As to escheats generally, see C. 6.51.
