

THINGS TO DO IN Laramie, WY

Laramie's one of those places where there's always something to do, and most of it is low-cost or free. From museums and art galleries to parks, murals, and easy outdoor adventures, there's something to check out no matter what season it is. Whether you're looking for a cozy indoor spot in the winter or a sunny activity in the summer, this guide rounds up all the simple, affordable ways to get out and enjoy Laramie year-round.

Art Galleries

Works of Wyoming

- Created to encourage Wyoming artists with networking, training and workshops. Includes fiber art, jewelry, leather work, paintings, photography, pottery, and woodwork.

4th Street Studios

- Features local handmade and events to make art with others. This studio rotates artists and themes throughout the year. Art parties and events are hosted year round.

Cooper Center of Creative Arts

- Provides an opportunity for creative self-expression for artists with disabilities who can challenge the status quo. Instructors guide and allow students to express their skills and creativity.

Artisans' Gallery

- Features over 59 artists and crafters including stained glass, tapestry works, batiks, gourd works, woodworks, handmade furnishings, jewelry, stationery and gift items.

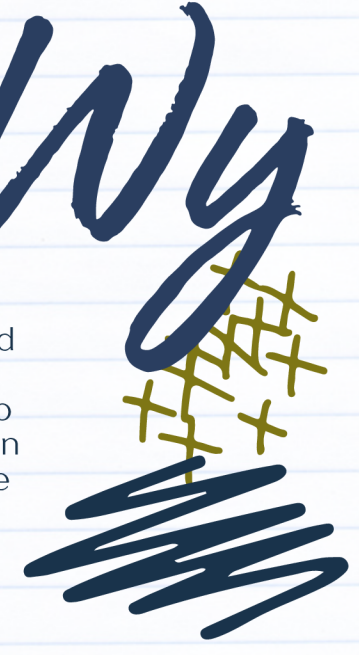
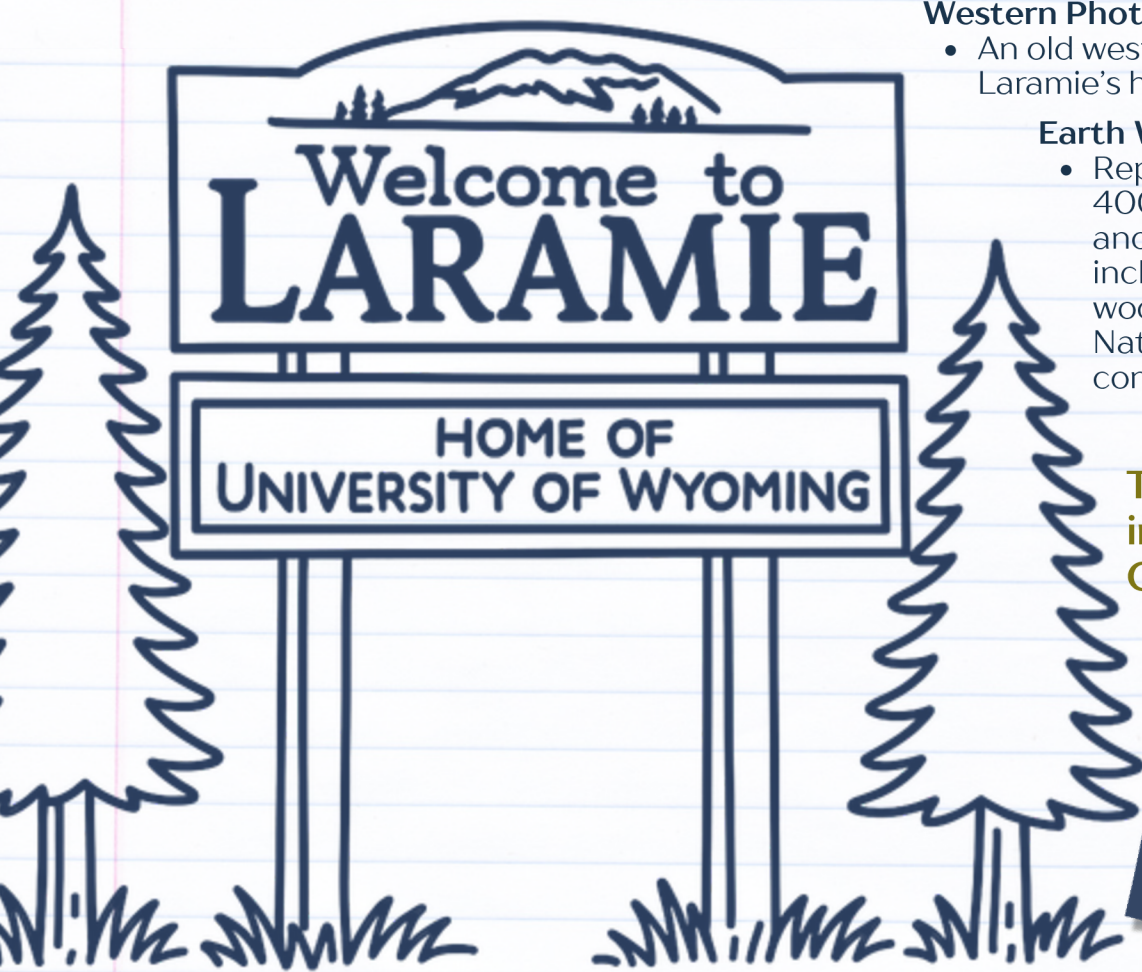

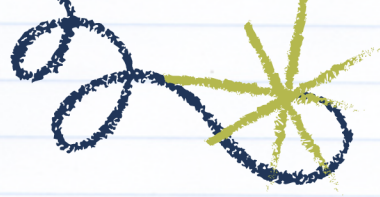
- An old western feel that tell a story of Laramie's history.

Earth Wind & Fire Gallery

- Represents the works of over 400 national and regional artists and contains original art including paintings, blown glass, woodworking, pottery, and Native American and contemporary jewelry.

Museums

Historic Laramie Union Pacific Train Depot

- The Depot is the original reason for Laramie's existence. It is the only remaining building left from the once large Union Pacific presence in Laramie and was added to the National Register of Historic Places in 1988. Free tours are available on Mondays from 9 am to 2 pm or by appointment.

Wyoming Territorial Prison State Historic Site

- This prison is the highlight of the Wyoming Territorial Prison State Historic Site built in 1872. Free self-guided tours.

University of Wyoming Insect Gallery

- The only museum with a research collection of insects in the state of Wyoming that holds both national and international significance.

American Heritage Center

- Holds an extensive collection of manuscripts, rare books, and university archives.

University of Wyoming Geological Museum

- A campus museum that houses a collection of rocks, minerals, fossils, and an augmented reality sandbox!

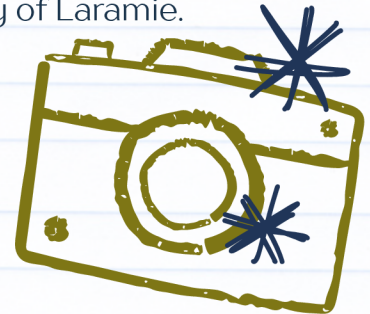
University of Wyoming Art Museum

- Hosts holiday events, artist talks, and drop-in meditations. There are also monthly Family Saturday Workshops where kids can view and create art.

Laramie Plains Museum (Ivinson Mansion)

- Contains an extensive collection of artifacts and archives including aspects from Western, Victorian, ranch, and immigration history all relating to the city of Laramie.

Albany County Public Library

- The local library in Laramie

Laramie Plains Civic Center

- Gymnasium, Art Gallery and community pottery studio

Gyphon Theater

- Located in Plains Civic Center, it has musicals, concerts, theatrical shows, and films throughout the year.

Harry C. Vaughan Planetarium

- The University of Wyoming offers public shows for a minimal cost (adults \$5. Students are \$3, kids 5 and under are free) and sometimes have free events and shows which are open to the public.

Outdoor Activities

Laramie Farmers Market

- Only summer to early fall. Many vendors with fresh produce, food trucks, art, and more.

Laramie City Parks

- Laramie has more than a dozen city parks with a variety of amenities, including a seasonally stocked fishing pond, skateboard park, splash pad, wading pool, jogging and biking paths, picnic shelters, and playgrounds..
