Our season title, Off to Europe, isn't just about repertoire. After all, a huge percentage of orchestral music is European. No, we actually are off to Europe. Your UW Symphony will be performing in Nice and Avignon, France, and Barcelona, Spain, during spring break. And so this beautiful season brochure reflects all that – where the composers are from (Sibelius' Finland, Wagner's Germany), and where we're going (the Mediterranean coast)!

There's more, of course: the Austria of Mozart, Haydn and Schubert, Tan Dun's China, Rimsky-Korsakov's Russia, Kodaly's Galanta (Slovakia), Guarnieri's Brazil, and the Italy of Verdi and Puccini. About a quarter of our choices are American: we'll have William Grant Still's Second Symphony, Song of a New Race; we're doing works by Ives and Valerie Coleman; and we've commissioned Colorado composer Wil Swindler to write a Concerto for Jazz Trio and Orchestra, to be performed by the incredible Ben Markley Trio.

Our soloists for the year are as exciting and as varied as the music. Ben Markley will be joined by drummer Andy Wheelock and bassist Seth Lewis for the jazz concerto premiere. Pianist Carlos Costa returns to Laramie for his third visit from Brazil. Cellist Beth Vanderborgh will play Tan Dun's fascinating Crouching Tiger Concerto, from the film score that was recorded by Yo-Yo Ma – and Rod Garnett will return to Laramie to play the Asian flute part. Finally we have four fabulous solo voices and the UW Choirs all joining us for the Mozart Requiem.

Truly, this will be an outstanding season. Order your season tickets now, and don't miss a performance!

You might ask, why are we embarking upon that exciting tour? Last spring we ended a Wyoming tour with an invited concert at Jackson's Grand Teton Music Festival. That large, sophisticated

audience, accustomed to their world-class summer orchestra, gave us four stand ovations. It was one of the most thrilling moments we've ever experienced. How can we follow that? Clearly, a bigger tour was in order.

Except for Bolivia in 2007, we've only performed near home, so it's time to spread our wings! A big tour will do wonders for the ensembles' esprit de corps, motivating the students' practicing, and the long, tiring rehearsals we do. When we went to Bolivia, many of them had never left the country, or even Wyoming. It will be a life-changing experience for them. This tour will burnish the orchestra's (and UW's) reputation, helping recruiting for years to come. For all those reasons, and more, an exciting trip like this is appropriate and well worth the effort.

You'll notice that the donation portion of the form has an extra line: "Special donation towards the European tour." We're trying to make this trip as affordable as possible for the students. While a great deal of funding has been identified, we need much more. Your regular Symphony Association donation will go where it always has, primarily to scholarships for talented musicians. I hope you'll consider the extra donation specifically towards our tour. The musicians and I would deeply appreciate it.
