

ADMINISTRATIVE EXPERIENCE

Dean, College of Arts, Humanities and Social Sciences, UW-Stout (2012-2014; 2015-present)

The College houses the School of Art and Design, five academic departments, approximately 140 faculty and academic staff members, nine undergraduate and two graduate programs serving 1,200 majors, with an annual operating budget of just under \$7 million.

Responsibilities include monitoring and oversight of all college budgets, hiring within the college, evaluation of personnel, curriculum development, and program assessment. Major initiatives have included a \$28 million restoration of a historic academic building; development of a School of Art and Design Advancement Board and case statement for a capital campaign; increased international professional development opportunities for faculty; increased study abroad and foreign language options for students (the addition of courses in Chinese, Russian, Arabic and Hmong); and grant writing.

Interim Director, Office of International Education, UW-Stout (2014-2015)

Led the English as a Second Language Institute, International Student Recruitment, International Student Services, Education Abroad and Education Away programs, and international partnerships. Began the process of accreditation of the ESL Institute; hired a Chinese specialist to focus curricular and recruitment efforts in China; wrote several successful grants; and developed new partnerships in Brazil and Kazakhstan. Responsible for risk and emergency management; immigration support; international visitors; strategic planning; assessment; alumni and external relations; and all budgets, including exchange, faculty-led study abroad programs, ESLI, scholarship funds, recruitment funds, international student fees and contingency accounts.

Director, UNI Institute of Humanities and Fine Arts in St. Petersburg (2001-2011)

Organized, advertised, recruited students and faculty, directed the program, and taught courses on Russian culture. This unique summer program combined intensive study of language and culture with individualized study in a student's area of specialization (art, music, theater, chemistry, communicative disorders, public health, etc.).
