# Introducing the Top 5 in 5 Update!

Each quarter, you can look forward to updates on our progress and milestones for our goal of elevating the University of Wyoming's Energy and Petroleum Engineering program to a **top 5** national ranking within the next five years.

If you are not already familiar with this initiative, you are in luck! Our website has been recently been refreshed to include a dedicated page for <u>The Top 5 in 5 Initiative</u> which includes a link to the initiative proposal and more information to get involved.

There are several exciting funding updates listed below that are in addition to the **\$2M** CEPS equipment fund that was announced in our June newsletter. Supported by UW's College of Engineering and Physical Sciences, this fund is set up for the purchase of equipment for the new **Integrated Fluid Dynamics/Geomechanics Research Lab**. This lab will focus on micro to macro studies of both conventional and unconventional plays in Wyoming.

### **New Funding Updates**

- \$300K: Establishing the Non-Endowed Chair in Subsurface Energy and Digital Innovation (SEDI) supported by Richard and Marlyn Lynch matched by the School of Energy Resources (July 2024). See the announcement for SEDI here
- \$310K: Subsurface Energy and Digital Innovation (SEDI) seed fund supported by the School of Energy Resources (July 2024).
- \$50K: Hassler Family Energy and Emerging Opportunities Excellence Fund (July 2024) to foster excellence and support faculty in the School of Energy Resources and College of Engineering and Physical Sciences.
- STOK: K-12 STEM Student Support from Hess Corporation (September 2024).
- \$1M: Fund for Student Success in Petroleum Engineering matched by the State of Wyoming (September 2024). The purpose of the Fund is to support and encourage graduate students who are studying petroleum engineering with a focus on drilling engineering at the University of Wyoming.
