This quarter's PRN is focusing on another difficult thing that some preceptors experience that is not weather related, and that is when a student is failing their rotation. Evaluating poor performance is challenging, but we do have a couple of resources available to assist you. Through CEImpact you can obtain 0.1 CEU credits when you complete the program, **"Failure to Fail: How to Evaluate Poor Performance"**. This course uses a published framework to discuss why preceptors struggle to assess poor performance and provides strategies to overcome barriers to appropriately evaluate underperforming learners.

To access CEImpact CE, follow the steps below:

1. Sign into your eValue account
2. Click on the "Learning Modules" tab
3. Click on "CEImpact" link in the blue ribbon right below the program tabs
4. Click on the "Connect to CEImpact Account"
5. **Use the Preceptor Access Code: 22UWY**

Another free educational resource available to you as a preceptor for the University of Wyoming School of Pharmacy is also through CEImpact and are the Precept2Practice podcasts. Listen as Dr. Lisa Richter and Dr. Kate Newman discuss the evidence and importance of failure in supporting student development. Upon successful completion of this course, learners should be able to:

1. Identify barriers to providing accurate assessment of underperforming learners
2. Discuss strategies to overcome barriers and support accurate assessment of underperforming learners
