

These preceptors were selected as Preceptors of the Year for the 2023-2024 academic year. They were selected out of several nominations submitted by both our P2 and P4 rotation students who wished to acknowledge the preceptors who made a difference in their lives. The two preceptors selected for this prestigious honor for the last academic year were Jade Enevoldsen and Kylee Willoughby.

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#### Jade Enevoldsen:

Jade graduated from the University of Wyoming School of Pharmacy in 2007 and has since spent 16 years working for Walmart Health and Wellness in a retail setting. Growing up in a small town in western Nebraska, he learned the importance of community and helping others.

Jade's career began in Salt Lake City as a staff pharmacist for Walmart, and he took the opportunity to transfer to Laramie to take the position of Pharmacy Manager at Walmart in 2014. He is passionate about providing students with various opportunities, including a growing number of clinical services, in a fast-paced setting while establishing strong connections within the community.

Many of Jade's student nominators commented that he was very interested in their learning and provided appropriate instruction, so they knew their roles early in the rotation.
