CE through the Collaborative Education Institute (CEI). This activity will provide you with 1.0 Hrs of CE. Learn about the thought processes, values, and expectations of millennial generation students on rotation and in the workforce.

3. Choose "CEI" within the submenu Taskbar
4. Click on "Connect to CEI Account" which takes you to the CEI Preceptor Education page
5. While there are many educational sessions available from CEI, to access the two module sessions listed above, click on the light green "Preceptors" icon. The Teaching & Learning Modules are the second to the last Preceptor Modules listed in the "Preceptors" section. You can register for free and complete the CE by following the on-screen prompts.
