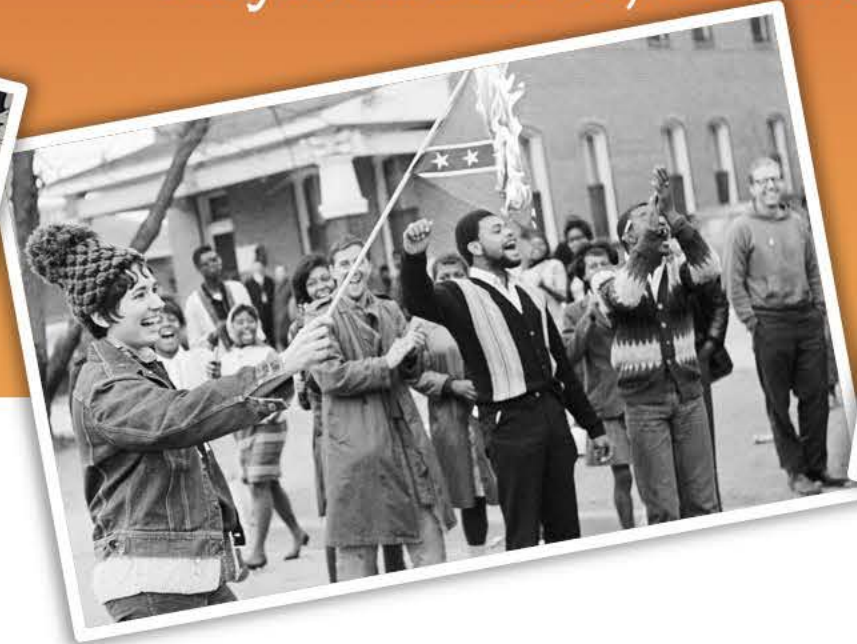


Fall 2021 RELI 2030 Violence and Resistance
