

This course is an introduction the diverse religious traditions of Asia, including Buddhism, Hinduism, Jainism, Sikhism, Daoism, Confucianism, Shinto, as dynamic living traditions with diverse and intertwining histories.

How did these traditions imagine the human person and their place in the world? How do humans exist in relation to society, to nature, and to themselves? How did these traditions think about human flourishing, and how best it might be attained? And how did they reflect on human frailty and suffering?

We will explore the basic elements of the religions we cover, including doctrines, rituals, key figures, scriptures, and material culture. We will also pay close attention to historical origins and developments as well as to the changing nature of Asian religions, both in Asia and as Asian religions spread worldwide.
