University of Wyoming Bitcoin Research Institute Workshop

July 13-17, 2026

The University of Wyoming Bitcoin Research Institute invites paper abstracts for a workshop to be held in Laramie, WY from July 13-17, 2026. Accepted participants will be provided food and lodging in Laramie, as well as a \$2500 stipend. Families are welcome.

Authors are invited to submit original abstracts up to 500 words, written in English, for papers on bitcoin that have not been published. In addition to presenting a paper, accepted participants will be expected to contribute to a co-authored state of knowledge paper drafted co-operatively during the final two days of the workshop.

Laramie is a land of sunshine located at 7200 feet above sea level between two mountain ranges. The schedule will include a midweek hike in the mountains, as well as down time to explore the town with others. The organizers hope it will be a time not only to receive feedback on works in progress and write together, but also develop projects with other participants and learn what bitcoin scholarship looks like across disciplinary boundaries.
