

## New Course Action Proposal (CAP)

Faculty start the course process by utilizing a CAP Initiation Form. These forms can be digital (Qualtrics) or the .PDF. This will be a choice between the faculty member and the Originator. Faculty need to fill these out fully before giving them to Originators. Any questions about missing information on the worksheets please follow up with that faculty member.
