Courses starting at any time after the hour, such as 9:10 a.m., 9:35 a.m., or 9:45 a.m., will be scheduled with the starting hour period.

For the preceding example, final exams would be scheduled at the 9 a.m. time.

Special Group Exams

Special requests for group examinations are scheduled on a first-request first-served basis. Periods where few examinations are given are tested first for conflicts with the requested group examination. If few conflicts occur, the requested group is scheduled at that time period with the instructor(s) requesting the special group being responsible for resolving student conflicts with an exam at the same time or with more than two examinations in one day. General Comments

Final exam times for classes meeting at times other than those listed are to be arranged during final examination week by the instructor concerned. It should be remembered that the following types of courses are not scheduled:

Law Courses
P.E. Activity Courses
Courses blocked first half of the semester
Off-Campus Courses (TBA)
Student Teaching (TBA)
Labs, Discussions, and Recitations
TBA courses

Courses below the "1000" level are scheduled even though a final examination may not be given Correspondence and Outreach Courses

Courses where Department Head and Dean have given timely approval for no final examination

Please note: Band, orchestra, choir choruses, individual lessons, seminars, special problems and topic courses, are scheduled even though a final exam may not be given.

Conflicts

Students having more than two exams on the same day, or two or more exams at the same time, and who desire to seek alleviation of this problem should see the Office of the Registrar prior to the first day of finals. The Registrar will provide verification of this fact which can be taken to the instructors for their consideration in making the necessary adjustment.

For the purpose of settling conflicts in the examination schedule, the term "burdened" instructor will be defined as the instructor who has the responsibility of giving an examination at other than the regularly scheduled time. In cases involving a student with two final examinations in one examination period, one of which is a special group exam, the instructor administering the special group exam will be the burdened instructor.

In cases involving a student with two final examinations in one examination period, both of which are regular final exams or special group exams, the instructor of the course which is first alphabetically by official course prefix (or first numerically if the courses are within the same department) is burdened in even-numbered years (e.g. 2018). The instructor of the course which is last alphabetically is burdened in odd-numbered years (e.g. 2019). For example, if the following had final exams at the same time period and the student was enrolled for both classes, the asterisk indicates the course in which the instructor was burdened.

In cases involving more than two final examinations in one day, the instructor administering the third examination if three are scheduled, or the third and fourth if four are scheduled, will be the burdened instructor(s).

In cases where a group examination(s) is involved and the student has more than two examinations in one day the instructor(s) administering the group examination(s) will be the burdened instructor(s). In cases where two group examinations and a regular examination(s) cause more than two examinations in one day, the instructors administering the group examination for the courses that are first alphabetically by official course prefix (or first numerically if the courses are within the same department) are burdened.

Note: Students enrolled in the pre-college level courses in MATH that are offered through the arrangement between the University of Wyoming and Laramie County Community College will need to see their instructor for exact time and place for their fall final exams.
